Introduction

In pursuance of the recommendations of a committee, set up by the Government of India in early 1960's, five Regional Centres for Research and Training in Municipal Administration (RCRTMA) were established at Delhi, Mumbai, Kolkata, Hyderabad and Lucknow. Subsequently these were rechristened as Regional Centre for Urban and Environmental Studies (RCUES). Presently only four RCUESs, at Lucknow, Hyderabad, Delhi and Mumbai are working.

The Regional Centre for Urban and Environmental Studies, Lucknow came into being in the University of Lucknow in January 1968 supported by the Government of India in the present Ministry of Urban Development. In 2000, the Union Ministry entered into an MOU with the University of Lucknow and since then the RCUES, Lucknow is being run under the joint guidance, supervision and control of the Lucknow University and the Ministry of Urban Development.

Objectives

RCUES, Lucknow since its establishment has strived to play a positive role in the activities, which are organized under inter-related programmes of training, research, consultancy, teaching and dissemination of information relating to the urban sector.

The principal objectives are:

- To undertake training of personnel & elected representatives of State Government, Urban Local Bodies in the States and other agencies dealing with Urban affairs and also for personnel from other developing countries;
- To undertake orientation courses for directly recruited municipal officers in the field of municipal administration and related matters;
- To organize seminars, workshops, symposia, conference, study tours etc. on various facts of urban government and administration;

- To undertake problem oriented research relating to various facts of municipal administration and related matters;
- To provide advisory and consultancy services to the Department of Urban Development and other related Department & Agencies in the participating States and Govt. of India on various issues relating to urban addition and urban planning and development and urban addition and development.
- To implement of environmental and ecological aspects;
 To implement government schemes and projects given by the Departments or Urban Development and other related Departments & Agencies of the participating State and Govt. of India;
- To act as a clearing house of ideas and information on research environment and urban ecology;
- To collaborate with other agencies, institutions and organizations in such a manner as may be necessary for the promotion of the
- Dojectives of the Centre;
 To discharge any other functions that may be entrusted to the Centre by the Ministry of Urban Development, Government of India or the
- To prepare, print and publish papers, periodicals and books in furtherance of the objectives of the Centre;
- To do all other things that incidental to or decisive for the attainment of furtherance of the aims and objectives of the Centre; and
- To do all the other things that are incidental to or decisive for management and control of the Centre.

Infrastructure

The RCUES, Lucknow is situated on the left bank of the river Gomti, which provides a picturesque view to the campus. It has a well equipped conference hall, meeting room, rooms for the faculty and the office. The Centre has a fully furnished Training Hostel-cum-Guest House for the officials and people's representatives participating in the different activities organized by it.

A new campus in the heart of town is being developed. A few residential houses have been built and a conference hall is lying semi-finished and the foundation of a Trainees Hostel is laid.

Library

The RCUES, Lucknow has developed a library within its own ^{*} campus. It has on its shelves about 5000 titles on almost all aspects dealing with urban development, management, environment, community development, urban health, slum improvement, water supply and sanitation etc. It also subscribes to a large number (more than three dozens) of leading national and international journals associated with the subject.

Publication

The RCUES regularly brings out a bi-annual bi-lingual journal titled URBAN PANORAMA besides a NEWSLETTER being published quarterly.

In addition, the papers presented at seminars organized, and the report of the research studies, undertaken by the RCUES are also published in book form.

Funding

The RCUES receives regular financial support in the form of non-plan grants-in-aid from the Government of India in the Ministry of Urban Development. The State Government of Uttar Pradesh, a major beneficiary, also gives regular non-plan grant. The other constituent states also extend a helping hand occasionally.

Jurisdiction

The RCUES, Lucknow is responsible for building and developing capacity, policy research input, consultancy in the States of Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, Madhya Pradesh, Orissa, Jharkhand, Chhatisgarh and Uttarakhand. The target group consists of the officials and people's representatives, community members etc. engaged in urban local bodies, development authorities, water institutions, housing boards, NGOs, CBOs etc. in the states falling under its jurisdiction.

Management

The functioning of the RCUES, Lucknow is guided by an MOU entered by the Union Ministry of Urban Development with the University of Lucknow. The rules governing the RCUES are in consistent with the rules and regulations of the Lucknow University and guidelines issued from time to time by the Ministry.

The RCUE, Lucknow is managed by a Governing Council constituted under the Chairmanship of the Vice-Chancellor of the University of Lucknow and the academic plan is guided by an Advisory Committee under the Chairmanship by the Principal Secretary/Secretary to the Government of U.P. in the Department of Urban Development. The Government of India in the Ministry of Urban Development, other constituent states and a few national research and training organizations are also represented on both the committees.

ACADEMIC PERFORMANCE

<u>NATIONAL SEMINAR ON</u> MANAGING URBAN WASTE FOR HEALTHY ENVIRONMENT

A two-day National Seminar on Managing Urban Waste for Healthy Environment (sponsored by Planning Commission, Government of India) was organized on September 4 & 5, 2005. The Chief Guest of the Inaugural function was Sri R. Ramani, IAS, Principal Secretary, Urban Development and Poverty Alleviation, Government of U.P. The other dignitaries present in the inaugural session were Padmasri Dr. S. C. Rai, Mayor of Lucknow, Dr. Navneet Sehgal, Director, Government of India, Department of Panchayati Raj, Prof. R.P. Singh, Vice Chancellor of Lucknow University and Chairman Governing Council of RCUES. The Seminar was organized to commemorate the memory of Prof. R.B. Das, the Founder Director of the Centre. Prof. C.P. Barthwal, Head, Department of Public Administration, Prof. J. L. Seth, Prof. S.K. Singh and Prof. S.N. Singh and others paid their tributes to Prof. Das and described him as a dynamic personality and saint in all respects. Earlier, Dr. U.B. Singh, Joint Director in RCUES and Coordinator of the Seminar gave a brief biographical sketch of Dr. Das.

Prof. Nishith Rai, Director, RCUES welcomed the guests and talked about the seminar that would deal with how to manage solid waste. He also explained as how several states are endeavouring to grapple the problem of solid waste.

Dr. Navneet Sehgal dwelt on rise in population due to the migration and lack of urban planning as reasons for increase in solid waste. He narrated that it is necessary to follow indigenous system to manage urban waste so that the project could be viable.

Dr. S.C. Rai described the topic as the need of the hour in which both Centre and State Governments are concerned. He said that in 1980, the population of Lucknow was about 5 lakhs and now it is 21 lakhs. Job opportunities and facilities in terms of education, health and entertainment attract people to the cities. Nagar Nigam has only 3600 sweepers, whereas it should have 28 sweepers per 10,000 population. It is necessary that each household should separate bio-degradable wastes from non-degradable ones and awareness should be created for that. Incinilators are aleady in use for disposal of bio-medical wastes. Solid wastes would not only pollute the air but also the underground water. So we have to be careful in managing solid waste. Surat has managed its solid waste excellently. Indore, Lucknow and Jaipur have been awarded for being clean and green cities. Lucknow should keep up this trend.

Sri R. Ramani in his inaugural address said that though he had not met Prof. Das he is very much touched by the description by his colleagues and students, who are still motivated by his magnetic personality. Speaking on the topic, he said that "only urban development department or Nagar Nigam cannot solve the problem but people's participation is required. The National Urban Renewal Mission would soon be implemented in metropolitan cities for integrated development of the urban areas".

Prof. R.P. Singh described that solid waste management is a challenging task. He gave examples "that like nuclear fusion can be both useful and harmful, so is plastic. Plastic is only 2% in weight as compared to other wastes. So it can easily be managed. Plastic should be separated from other wastes and sent for recycling". He requested the Center to make a plant on solid waste in the University which would be funded by the University. (In response the RCUES has facilitated the setting up the collection & disposal plant under PPP).

Delegates and Participation

The Academics, Policy Makers, Environmentalists, Administrators, Practitioners, Researchers, NGOs, People's Representatives from across the country were invited to the Seminar. In all seven states i.e. Delhi, Madhya Pradesh, Bihar, Orissa, Uttaranchal, Maharashtra besides Uttar Pradesh were represented. The participants were drawn from the state governments in the department of urban development, government of India, water institutions, town & country planning organizations, pollution control boards, research institutions, universities, urban local bodies, civil society, NGOs etc. In all 95 delegates enriched the deliberations. The list of participants is appended as Annexure P-1.

Proceedings

In all 19 papers were presented by the delegates.

The valedictory address was delivered by Sri S.A.T. Rizvi, Chairman, Third State Finance Commission, U.P.

Policy Recommendations

- 1. A Solid Waste Management Cell to be established in the RCUES, Lucknow. The Cell should be made responsible for creating data bank, survey, help prepare projects for collection and disposal of waste in urban local bodies in U.P. A Manual should also be developed by the RCUES.
- 2. The State Government should formulate an Urban Waste Management Policy to deal with the increasing problems of waste in urban centres.
- 3. An 'Environment Cell' to be opened in municipatities having of population more than one lakh. A post of Environmental Engineer be created and a suitable person should be posted for taking care of the waste related environment problem. Any dead municipal cadre may be converted in environmental engineering cadre.
- 4. The school/college children be organized as Green Battalion and be associated with environment awareness campaign in cities.

- 5. The NGOs/RWAs and other CBOs be encouraged and associated with the door-to-door garbage collection.
- 6. Sites/locations in master plan of cities be clearly identified for landfill.
- 7. Community should be enlightened of the benefit of segregation, reduction and reuse of house-hold garbage.
- 8. The decentralized disposal system in large cities be developed to eliminate collection from secondary place (municipal bins) and dispose off locally thus reducing transportation cost.
- 9. The plastic waste may be used for other purposes including producing hydrocarbon, if possible.
- 10. The rag-pickers be formally involved in the whole process.
- 11. The public-private partnerships be encouraged. A part of the city may be experimented with NGO/RWA/DWCUA groups etc. and the experiences may be emulated gradually in other parts as well. The necessary amendments in municipal laws be made to facilitate private sector participation.
- 12. The community should be motivated to bear the cost of waste management, hence, user charges be levied. If required, necessary amendments in enactments be made.
- 13. The State/Central Pollution Control Boards should play an active role in getting the concerned rules implemented strictly. They should not be confined just to issue No Objection Certificate.
- 14.A series of extensive training programmes for elected representatives and officials of urban local bodies be held for making them aware about the rules related to Environment Protection, Handling of Biomedical Wastes and Municipal Wastes.
- 15. The hospital waste should be segregated at the place of generation only and for the purpose para medical staff be trained and developed. The Seminar was coordinated by Dr. U. B. Singh, Joint Director.

REGIONAL WORKSHOP ON

JAWAHARLAL NEHRU NATIONAL URBAN RENEWAL MISSION

The Government of India has launched a series of ambitious schemes for developing infrastructure in all the cities and towns in the country. These reforms based planned development efforts are coherent strategy for developing our cities. These mission mode schemes are broadly divided into parts. The main scheme entitled as Jawaharlal Nehru National Urban Renewal Mission (JNNURM) is applicable in 63 big selected cities. The INNURM has two sub missions - Urban Infrastructure and Governance and Basic Services for the Urban Poor. The two other omnibus schemes formulated for the remaining cities/towns are Urban Infrastructure Development Scheme for Small & Medium Towns (UIDSSMT) and Integrated Housing & Slum Development Programme (IHSDP).

The Union Ministry of Urban Development is responsible for monitoring the sub-mission on Urban Infrastructure and Governance and the Urban Infrastructure Development Scheme for Small and Medium Towns (UIDSSMT). Both these schemes are meant for infrastructure development in whole city.

The sub-mission on Basic Services to the Urban Poor and the omnibus scheme on Integrated Housing and Slum Development Programme (IHSDP) focus on urban poor only and are monitored by the Union Ministry of Housing & Urban Poverty Alleviation.

The Jawaharlal Nehru National Urban Renewal Mission (JNNURM) and the other two omnibus schemes were formally launched by the Hon'ble Prime Minister of India in the presence of a galaxy of Hon'ble Ministers and Secretaries in charge of urban development in the states and other officials on 3rd December 2005 at Viyan Bhawan, New Delhi.

The first Regional Workshop on Jawaharlal Nehru National Urban Renewal Mission (JNNURM) and the omnibus schemes, after launch, was organized by RCUES, Lucknow under the joint auspices of Department of Urban Development, GOUP at Lucknow. This one-day affair aimed to acquaint the participating state governments with the philosophy of this historic effort and also to have a first hand information of implementing strategy as conceived by the states.

Duration & Date

The day-long Regional Workshop on JNNURM (sub-mission I) and UIDSSMT was held on December 30, 2005 from 9.00 a.m. to 4.00 p.m. It was sponsored by the Ministry of Urban Development, Government of India and was organized by the RCUES, Lucknow in collaboration with the Government of U.P.

Venue

The Workshop was organized at Hotel Taj Residency, Lucknow.

Participation

The Workshop was designed for the states of Uttar Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, Bihar and Uttaranchal.

The Secretaries, incharge of Urban Development and the Directors of Municipal Administration from these four northern states were invited. In addition, Mayors and Municipal Commissioners of the 16 cities selected under JNNURM in these states were also invited for the Workshop. The Secretaries/ incharge of Housing and Urban Planning, Planning, Health, Education, Environment, Managing Director of UPSRTC, Chief Town Planner, General Managers of Jal Sansthans and the senior government officers of U.P. were also invited.

The workshop was graced by a team of higher officials from the Government of India led by Sri M. Rajamani, Joint Secretary (UD). Sri Pankaj Jain, Joint Secretary (UE&PA) also attended the workshop. The state of Uttar Pradesh was represented by Sri D.C. Mishra, Secretary of Urban Development. The team from Bihar government was led by its Under Secretary, Dr. M.A. Izaji, while Sri U.K. Sadho, Joint Director in the Directorate of Municipal Administration headed a team consisting of Commissioners and Mayors from M.P. The state of Uttaranchal was represented by the elected municipal representatives headed by Smt.of Manorama dabriyal Sharma, Mayor of Dehradun and the President of All India Council of Mayors.

In all 148 officers and people's representatives enriched the deliberations. The complete list is furnished at Annexure P-II.

Faculty/Resource Persons

The details of Resource' Persons from Government of India and the participating States are furnished at Appendix F-I.

Summary of Proceedings

Sri D.C. Mishra, Secretary, Urban Development, Government of U.P., while welcoming the delegates said that "it is a matter of pride for the Government of U.P. that the Ministry of Urban Development, Government of India, who, after having commenced a joint campaign with the JNNURM, Development Ministry, Government of India, Urban Development Development of U.P. and it's Regional Centre, I whole ment of the guests. In this joint venture, 63 cities of the country been selected and in the remaining cities two projects named DESMT and IHSDP will be commissioned".

Prof. R.P. Singh, V.C., Lucknow University felt privileged to visit of cities abroad and observed that "none of these cities has the like transport, environment, slums, lack of basic amenities which presently faced by cities in India. Deeply concerned with these problems have organized this workshop for the first time. Now comes 'health': are hospitals run in western countries and look after the patients? How tackle a road accident, etc. I assure you that whatever responsibilities given to us, will be fulfilled by us (RCUES) to the entire satisfaction of the athorities of this project".

Sri M. Rajamani, Joint Secretary, Urban Development, Government india said "that the Government of India has chosen Lucknow to host the regional workshop. Six more workshops are to follow. This workshop is cally to sensitize the states and urban local bodies about the flow of process and how the cities need to prepare the development plan what should put in the memorandum of agreement, which will have the process for various reforms. In order to support the state governments we approached agencies to adopt cities and states, and assist them. We also sought technical assistance from the Asian Development Bank by who have promised to provide 2 million dollors' technical assistance. It is the biggest programme ever conceived and ever implemented at the level for urban development. This is a golden opportunity for the take full advantage when we are there, standing like a rock to approximate.

Sri R. Ramani, Chief Secretary, Government of U.P. said that is ever increasing, because of which there is a mad rush of rural development in several ways, so that we can stop the rural from racing towards cities. However, for the first time, attention paid to urban development in order to take care of the poor rural trying to settle down in urban areas, like slum development, etc. though these projects were very limited. However, in this new project for upliftment of the poor, there is a sub-mission, called the Basic Services for the Urban Poor. It has also been decided that as long as this is not included in the development plans and DPRs no financial aid shall be made available. Two other projects named UIDSSMT and IHSDP, have been commissioned. I shall request the honorable Urban Development Minister to guide us so that we may not ignore the smaller cities".

Sri Md. Azam Khan, Hon'ble Minister for Parliamentary Affairs, Water Supply, Urban Development and Urban Employment & Poverty Alleviation, Government of U.P. inaugurated the workshop by lighting the customary lamp. In his inaugural speech the Hon'ble Chief Guest said that "invariably it so happens that even charity goes only to those hands which are charming. I have neither any objections nor any complaints. I would only like to say that politicians may come and go but the bureaucrats who are the backbone of the central and state governments happen to be there and they have to work with the fullest of vigor. Some of such bureaucrats are seated here who have seen how the people at district levels have been illtreated in the days that have passed by. All tall promises made to them in relation to their betterment have remained only promises. We have seen this. I will request all of you to kindly forgive me for saying that just having a seminar in the Taj Hotel is not enough. The central government is the one that takes all the basic decisions and subsequent implementations are got done by states. Only big cities which are already big get more attention. If at all any smaller city say, Meerut, all of a sudden gets some importance obviously due to political reasons, it is not fair. Let us all in right earnest, with all our might work for the uplift of the rural folk, who are dangling between life and death for want of basic amenities which are till now denied to them".

Prof. Nishith Rai, Director, RCUES, Lucknow thanked all the invitees, guests of honour, other participants and assured the Hon'ble Minister for Urban Development, Chief Minister of U.P. Sri Mulayam Singh Yadav, the state government machinery and also the central government for mooting such an ambitious programme. He further said, "let us assure all the concerned that we shall do our utmost to shoulder all the responsibilities entrusted to us, and execute them to the fullest satisfaction of all the concerned."

Sri Rajamani, Joint Secretary, Ministry of Urban Development presented the detailed provisions of JNNURM and UIDSSMT.

This was followed by a presentation on CDP by Dr. Usha P. Raghupati, Acting Director of National Institute of Urban Affairs, New Delhi. Other presentations by Sri S.P. Singh, Special Secretary, Urban Development on the developmental plans and progress in U.P., Sri M.A. Izazi, Representative from Bihar and Sri U.K. Sadho, Representative from Madhya Pradesh and Sri Diwakar Tripathi, Director, SUDA followed.

Smt. Manorama Dabriyal Sharma, Mayor of Dehradun and President All India Council of Mayors said that "this is the foremost project wherein urban development agencies have been made responsible for development of cities. But, unfortunately, the city units are not financially strong to undertake such schemes single-handedly. Even the poor citizens are not in a position to contribute sufficiently. Hence, it is absolutely essential for the Government of India to consider these factors in favour of the state The urban units need to be given proper training in this governments. direction. Today our Nation, for that matter the entire world, is sitting on a heap of filfth and garbage. We all are today affected by the fast rate of ever increasing population, depleting water tables, polluted environment, etc. Since we, as either mayors or in any other capacity directly connected with the people as their representatives, are responsible for solving the public problems. Invariably, it so happens that in spite of our sincere efforts to help the citizens, we are handicapped for want of guidance and assistance from the higher authorities. Governments may come and go but the bureaucracy being the same, is responsible for the betterment of the general public. So, by remaining impartial and fearless the bureaucrats should come forward to assist us. I therefore appeal to all those present here to co-operate and assist us in the execution of our responsibilities and duties".

Sri Aniruddha Kumar, Director (UD), Government of India while wrapping up the discussion said that the four states which are present here, i.e., U.P., Bihar, M.P. and Uttaranchal badly need urban governance. So, we are starting our programme with Lucknow. He said that Urban Development Minister delivered a very inspiring and thought provoking speech which clearly shows that the Government of U.P. is highly committed to the compaign of JNNURM.

Vote of thanks was delivered by Sri S.P. Singh, Special Secretary, Urban Development, Government of U.P.

The workshop was coordinated by Dr. U.B. Singh, Joint Director.

BIHAR

1. CHANGING ROLE OF URBAN LOCAL BODIES IN THE CONTEXT OF 74th CAA

The Centre organized a one-day programme on the subject on 3rd April 2005 at Gopalganj. The objectives were: to acquaint the participants with the provisions of 74th CAA; and to discuss the roles and responsibilities of elected representatives in urban administration.

Participants

The participants of the training programme were officials and elected representatives of all the four Nagar Panchayats of Gopalganj District i.e. Gopalganj, Barauli, Mirganj and Kattaya. In all 55 persons participated in the training programme. List of participants is furnished at Annexure P-III.

Faculty

In the training programme only internal faculty was used. The details are shown at Appendix F-II.

Feedback

The participants at the end of the day felt more confident in handling the challenges of urban administration, as this was their first ever training they had received. The participants felt that such trainings should be made compulsory for those who are associated with urban administration especially elected representatives. All the participants suggested that they may be given training on other aspects of Urban Administration as well and more such programmes should be organized in the near future.

The programme was directed by Dr. Rajeev Narayan, Dy. Director.

2. CAPACITY DEVELOPMENT FOR URBAN GOVERNANCE

In view of the growing importance of capacity building in urban administration for effective local governance and the observed weaknesses of local governments, the Regional Centre organized this one day training programme for the elected representatives of Urban Local Bodies on May 14, 2005 in Patna.

Objectives

The objectives of the programme were: to sensitize the participants with the changed roles and responsibilities; to discuss the related issues of functional and financial devolution; to emphasise upon departmental integration in planning and implementation of urban development schemes; and to discuss various aspects of municipal administration; and to familiarize the participants with the measures to achieve good urban governance.

Participants

The elected representatives of Nagar Palika Parishads of Danapur, Khagaul, and Phulwari Sharif Nagar Panchayats, which are part of Urban Agglomeration of Patna were the participants of the training programme. Fifty five participants including municipal officials participated in the training programme. The details of participants is given at Annexure P-IV. Faculty

The faculty consisted of internal and external members. Among externals those invited included the experts/specialists in the field were officials and experts from Directorate of Local Bodies, HUDCO, Town Planning, Environment and Forestry etc. The list is furnished at Appendix F-III.

Inauguration

Dr. Shakeel Ahmad, IAS Commissioner and Secretary, Department of Urban Development, Government of Bihar was the Chief Guest. In his inaugural address he appreciated the role of RCUES in providing training to municipal officials and elected representatives in the State of Bihar. He said that the Constitution Seventy Fourth Amendment Act, 1992 provides for gradual devolution of development and decision making functions to the local bodies. This Amendment also provides for preparation of district and metropolitan development plans. The preparation of development plans, which integrate investments and their spatial implications need a participatory plan making process. There is a growing demand of barefoot professionals, to cater to the local needs and to act as a link between the local bodies and the people. In this regard RCUES is contributing much for strengthening the local bodies.

Prof. Nishith Rai, Director, RCUES welcomed the chief guest, municipal officers and the participants. He requested the state government to collaborate with the RCUES activities and to provide assistance in organizing the training programmes/seminars. He informed the participants of the various activities conducted by RCUES in seven states i.e. Uttar Pradesh, Madhya pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Bihar, Jharkhand, Orissa and Uttaranchal.

Dr. Anjuli Mishra, Course Director, discussed with the participants about the objectives and contents of the training programme.

Mr. S.K. Sinha, Consultant (RCUES) for Bihar and Jharkhand acquainted the participants with the needs and requirements of training in Bihar. He also discussed about the situation of urban administration in the state of Bihar after 74th CAA.

Valedictory Session

Mr. Mohd. Aftab Alam, Chairman, State Council of Chairpersons of Local Bodies, Bihar was the chief guest of the session. Participants presented their suggestions regarding the improvement in the procedure of urban management before the chairman. Chairman made his comments on the related issues. Prof. Nishith Rai, Director of RCUES assured that their suggestions would be put before the state government with his comments for necessary actions.

Feedback

This was the first exposure of the elected representatives. All the participants were very enthusiastic about the training. They responded very positively. They felt that more such courses on various aspects of urban development and management should be conducted.

CAPACITY DEVELOPMENT FOR URBAN GOVERNANCE 3.

This second programme in the series was organized at Gaya on May 16, 2005,

Participants

Inauguration

Mr. Rai Madan Kishore, District Development Commissioner, Gaya was the chief guest. In his inaugural address he said that the concept of local self government is based on the assumption that there are certain basic human needs having direct bearing on the lives of individuals and the community as a whole. Such needs can be better fulfilled by a government to which the individuals and the local community have direct and easy access. Thus certain civic functions such as garbage collection, cleaning of streets, drainage, water supply, fire services and health services are of considerable importance for a healthy and comfortable civic life. These services are primary responsibility of urban local bodies. They can perform their duties only when they have full capacity to achieve their aims. RCUES, Lucknow is supporting them to build and upgrade their skills by giving training to the various level of functionaries of urban local bodies. He thanked RCUES for performing this ever needed purposeful work.

Mr. S.K. Sinha, Consultant for Bihar and Jharkhand made the participants aware about the needs and importance of training in the state of Bihar in the view of 74th CAA.

Dr. Anjuli Mishra, Dy. Director while welcoming the chief guest and participants deliberated on the purpose, objectives and contents of training programme in brief. She familiarized the participants with the activities of the RCUES.

Valedictory Session

At the valedictory session Mr. Tarkeshwar Prasad, District Planning Officer, Gaya was the chief guest. He addressed the participants and distributed certificates.

Feedback

All the participants were very responsive. They interacted with the speakers about the topic. They felt that the input given in the training programme was very useful and beneficial as it would improve their efficiency and working capacity.

1. WORKSHOP ON NATIONAL URBAN RENEWAL MISSION

The objectives of the workshop were: to sensitize the participants with a number of reforms in the urban sector initiated by the ministry of urban development to foster the development process at the state level; to discuss the various schemes/programmes implementing by the ministry under which financial and technical assistance is provided to the state governments; to discuss the strategy and components of National Urban Renewal Mission and its two submissions in details; and to discuss the scheme of UIDSSMT and IHSDP in their new structure.

In his inaugural address he said that the urban local bodies have the prime responsibility for providing infrastructure and services but they lack capacity for planning and management, decision making, financial resources, autonomy and authority to determine and collect adequate levels of service charges. The legal and administrative systems concerning urban planning, governance and management are archaic. Many of the urban legislations, instead of facilitating urban infrastructure development create hindrances and distortions in the development process. In this background, the scheme of National Urban Renewal Mission is a golden opportunity for cities to become self sustained. The Regional Centre is performing a thankful job by creating awareness amongst government officials and municipal officials along with guiding them to achieve good governance.

It was a great pleasure for the participants to know about the new scheme of National Urban Renewal Mission which was yet to be launched. The participants were very enthusiastic and participatory. They requested the government officials to conduct municipal elections as soon as possible in their state as it is a necessary pre-condition to access central assistance.

2. SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT

A two-day programme on Solid Waste Management was conducted at the ATI, Ranchi on 25-26 October 2005.

Objectives

The basic objectives of the programme were: to make the participants aware of the various steps involved in solid waste management; to discuss importance of involvement of private sector and community groups in solid waste management process; to help participants to understand the entire process of the management of bio-medical waste; to discuss on the methods of recycling waste.

Participants

Feedback

The suggestions made by the participants were solid waste should be divided into two groups-Residential, Industrial and segregating those wastes, that can be reused.

The programme was directed by Dr. Urmila Bagga, Joint Director.

2. PUBLIC-PRIVATE PARTNERSHIP IN MANAGING URBAN SERVICES

Another programme in the series was organised on June 16-17, 2005 at Bhopal.

Participation

The programme was attended by 38 participants from various Nagarpalikas and Nagar Panchayats of Madhya Pradesh. A list of participants is seen at Annexure P-IX.

Feedback and Suggestions

The participants suggested that clear provisions for public-private partnership should be incorporated into Municipal Acts; City governments should encourage community based organizations, resident associations, neighbourhood committees, NGOs etc. functioning in the city into partnership for the provision and management of services within the clearly defined role and objectives of each partner; Initially public-private partnership for provision of one service should be carried out in a particular sector/zone of the city. After achieving the desired results, the successful practice can be replicated in other areas of the city; The duration of training programme should be enhanced and two days should be devoted to preparation of viable and feasible detailed project reports; Minimum educational qualifications should be prescribed for contesting the election of municipal councilors so that they are able to understand properly the intricacies of city administration as well as mobilization of revenues for and responsibilities assigned to municipal performing the duties organizations; The entire functioning of municipal organizations should be computerized and the relevant soft-wares for taxation and accounting etc. should be made available to all urban local bodies in order to maintain uniformity.

The programme was directed by Dr.(Mrs.) Urmila Bagga, Joint Director.

4. RAIN WATER HARVESTING

The Centre organized a one-day training programme on August 24, 2005 for the officials of urban local bodies of Madhya Pradesh at Chhatarpur.

Objectives

The major objectives of the programme were: to acquaint the participants with the grave situation arising out of depleting ground water level; to highlight the need and importance of water conservation and augmentation of the ground water resources; to discuss the various techniques of rain water harvesting; to emphasise upon the community and private sector participation in water conservation; and to familiarize the officials with the initiatives taken by other states/various agencies.

Feedback and Suggestions

The participants suggested that the duration of the programme should not be less than three days. Other important suggestions were: existing ponds and other water bodies should not be allowed to be filled with soil and sold to land mafias; green belts and open lands in the urban areas should be maintained for natural recharging of rainwater; all drinking water and other ground water based programmes must have rain water harvesting as in-built component; a consultancy and coordination cell should be established at city level for providing technical support and guidance to the implementing organization as well as to the general public; since public participation is the most vital component for the successful implementation of RWH programmes, the community needs to be educated and informed about the various techniques of water conservation; NGOs, Mohalla Committees, Resident Welfare Associations, Ward Committees and CDS, Women groups etc. should be effectively involved in motivating public to check the misuse and wastage of water.

The programme was coordinated by Dr.(Mrs.) Urmila Bagga, Joint Director.

5. DISCIPLINARY ACTION

A two-day training programme on the subject was organized from 24-25 of October, 2005 at Lucknow.

Objectives

The major objectives of the programme were: to review the current situation relating to urban poverty and programmes implemented for poverty alleviation; to analyse the reasons for the poor impact of UPA programmes on poverty reduction and to suggest the remedial measures for the same; to sensitise the participants with the concept, components and other salient features of NURM & IHSDP.

Participants

Eleven Project Officers from various DUDA's of Madhya Pradesh actively participated in the programme. Annexure P-XIIV provides the list of participants.

Sri Sanjay Bhoosreddy, Secretary, Non-Conventional Energy Department, Government of Uttar Pradesh delivered the valedictory address on the final day of the programme.

Faculty

External as well as internal faculty made their valuable contribution to the programme. The list of faculty is shown at Appendix F-XII.



Feedback and Suggestions

The participants expressed their satisfaction with the overall conduct and achievment of the programme. Majority of the participants felt that it was a matter of great self-satisfaction for them to help the people who belong to the unprevileged and marginalised sections of society. It also gave them extreme happiness and satisfaction when even one of the beneficaries emerges successful after the needed help is provided to them under the UPA programmes.

Important suggestions put forth by the participants included:

Poor people are exploited by the middlemen. A proper mechanism needs to be evolved to check this practice; Training hours should be as per the trade requirements; Restriction of 300 hours of training in the chosen trade etc. under SJSRY needs to be amended accordingly; DUDA officers should have an upperhand in the selection of beneficiaries; Beneficiaries have to run from to post to avail the loan facility under SJSRY as banks take unduly long time to process and finalise the loan applications. Banks, therefore, should be instructed strictly to follow the instructions as per RBI guidelines; The frequent transfer of P.O.s from one place to other place adversely impacts the smooth functioning of projects. This practice needs to be curtailed; CDS should be trained at DUDA level.

1. URBAN POVERTY ALLEVIATION: PROBLEMS & PROSPECTS

This three-day programme was organized on December 21-23, 2005 at Lucknow.

Objectives

The objectives of the course were: to analyse the existing situation relating to urban poverty and the programmes implemented for its alleviation; to identify the major causes for the poor impact of UPA programmes and to suggest remedial measures for the same; and to familiarize the officials with the salient features of JNNURM & IHSDP.

Participants

The programme was attended by Project Officers from various DUDA's of Madhya Pradesh & Uttar Pradesh. Besides lecture-discussion sessions on various aspects of UPA, field visit to different project areas were also arranged. The list of participants is shown at Annexure P-XV.

Faculty

Besides the internal faculty, the guest faculty was drawn from SUDA, lead bank and NGOs. The details of faculty are furnished at Appendix F-XIII.

Feedback and Suggestions

The participants suggested that duration of such programme should not be less than a week; Field visits to other states should also be arranged; Successful implementation of UPA programmes demands highly committed officials/employees; Regular training of C.O.s/CDS should also be organized at district level.

The course was directed by Dr. Urmila Bagga, Joint Director.

ORISSA

1. URBAN POVERTY ALLEVIATION PROGRAMMES (TWO)

The Centre organized two training programmes on Swarn Jayanti Shahri Rozgar Yojana (SJSRY) from May 11 to 12, 2005 and May 13 to 14, 2005 respectively.

Objectives

The main objectives of the training programmes were to acquaint the participants with the importance of SJSRY and other UPA Programmes; to make the participants aware of the need and importance of community based organizations, Thrift and Credit Societies, DWCUA Groups; and to discuss the bottle necks in the implementation of the programme and suggest remedial measures.

Participants

The course was designed for the newly appointed Community Organizers under UPA programmes. 26 Community Organizers reported for the first training programme where as 28 Community Organizers participated in the second training programme. A complete list is furnished at Annexures P-XVI & P-XVII.

Faculty

The faculty for the courses comprised internal and guest. The details are furnished at Appendix F-XIV.

Feedback

The participants suggested that Community Organizers should be appointed on full time basis and not with additional charge; NHC should be free to amend the BPL list as and when required; there should be no political interference in the implementation of UPA programmes; banks should be asked to sanction loans to the beneficiaries faster and without creating aurdles; the marketing of the products produced by the beneficiaries, DUDA should extend a helping hand; for TC societies, limit of revolving fund should be increased; sufficient and timely release of SJSRY funds should be ensured; council should be bound to execute the development plans prepared by the NHC; training programmes should be organized at the DUDA level of CBO functionaries; CBO's should be involved and made responsible for updating the data base.

Dr.Rajeev Narayan, Deputy Director directed both the programmes.

2. PROPERTY TAX ADMINISTRATION

A two-day training programme on the subject was organised on September 9&10, 2005 at Bhubaneshwar.

Objectives

The programme objectives included to : familiarize the participants with the scenario relating to municipal finances with special reference to property taxes; discuss the experiences of property tax reforms in various states; discuss the self assessment scheme of property tax; discuss the issues relating to valuation, assessment, imposition, and collection of property taxes; and identify the shortcomings and suggest remedial measures.

Participants

About 10 Chairpersons, Executive Officers and Tax officials from urban local bodies in the state participated in the programme. A complete list of participants is appended as Annexure P-XVIII.

Faculty

The course faculty comprised internal as well as external faculty. The details are furnished at Appendix F-XV.

Feedback

The observations as emerged include conduct of more training programmes on various aspects of urban development including the tax administration.

The programme was conducted by Dr.Rajeev Narayan, Deputy Director.

3. NATIONAL URBAN RENEWAL MISSION (NURM)

An orientation training of two days on this proposed initiative was held on September 11 & 12, 2005 at Bhubaneshwar.

Objectives

The objectives were to acquaint the participants with need and importance of NURM and to highlight the main provisions of both the submissions and omnibus schemes.

Participants

The participants included officers from urban local bodies and town and country planning directorate. In all 11 officers participated in the programme. The details are furnished at Annexure P-XIX.

Faculty

Course faculty comprised internal as well as guest. The details are given in Appendix F-XVI.

Feedback

The programme was appreciated by the participants and they suggested to orient all the officials as well as elected representatives. They were apprehensive of time scheduling and financial pattern, and suggested the advance release of fund for preparing perspective and development plans and also for under taking capacity building programe; some changes in financial pattern were also suggested.

The programme was conducted by Dr.Rajeev Narayan, Deputy Director.

4. PUBLIC-PRIVATE PARTNERSHIP IN MUNICIPAL SERVICES

A two-day training programme for sensitizing officials of urban local bodies of Orissa on scope of public private partnership in the provision of urban services was held on September 14-15, 2005 at Bhubaneshwar.

Objectives

The programme objectives included to acquaint the officials with need and importance of initiating public-private partnership in the provision of municipal services and to discuss various good practices and initiatives.

Participants

About 14 officers drawn from different local bodies attended the rogramme. The details are furnished at Annexure-P-XX.

Faculty

The internal faculty was supplemented by guest ones. The details are furnished at Appendix F-XVII.

Feedback

The programme helped sensitized the municipal officials towards the urgent need of associating private sector for the provision and maintenance of urban services. They wanted more and more such exposures.

The course was directed by Dr.Rajeev Narayan, Deputy Director.

UTTAR PRADESH

1. WORKSHOP ON GREEN CITIES: PLAN FOR THE PLANET

On the occasion of **World Environment Day** the Regional Centre organized a workshop on the subject on 5th June, 2005 in collaboration with the Centre for Environment Education, North Zone, Lucknow. The workshop was attended by environmentalists, teachers, researchers, urban managers, policymakers and administrators. About 52 persons participated in the deliberations.

The main objective of the workshop was to create an awareness amongst the urban managers, policymakers and administrators about the various dimensions of urban environment and to have meaningful and fruitful discussions on the subject.

Prof.R.P.Singh, Chief Guest and Vice-Chancellor of Lucknow University in his inaugural address emphasized on keeping the cities clean, green and free from polythene. He also stressed on the need of turning wastes' to 'wealth'. Sri R.Ramani, Principal Secretary, Urban Development, Govt. of U.P. in his remarks expressed his deep concern for the efficient management of solid wastes. Sri T.N.Dhar, Honourary Secretary, IIPA, U.P.Branch focussed on the need of initiating IEC Information, Education and Communication) in waste management. Dr.Navneet Sehgal, Secretary (IT), Govt. of U.P. highlighted the need of introducing e-governance for efficient management of urban wastes.

The workshop was coordinated by Dr.U.B.Singh, Joint Director.

2 PROPERTY TAX ADMINISTRATION

With a view to streamlining the administration of property tax, the Regional Centre for Urban and Environmental Studies organized this threeday training programme on June 7-9, 2005 at Lucknow.

Objectives

The main objectives of the programme were: to familiarize the participants with the scenario relating to municipal finances, with special

reference to property taxes; to discuss the experience of property tax reforms in various states; to discuss the self-assessment scheme of property tax as introduced in the municipal corporations of the State; to discuss the issues relating to various aspects like valuation and assessment, imposition, collection and recovery, etc.,to suggest ways to strengthen the system of property tax administration.

Participants

The programme was attended by fourteen senior municipal officials, including Assistant Municipal Commissioners of Nagar Nigams and Executive Officers from Nagar Palika Parishads of the State of U.P. The list of participants is annexed at Annexure P-XXI.

Faculty

The Guest Faculty included senior officials from the State Government and financial experts and consultants. However, the Faculty of the RCUES also presented their views and delivered lectures on the relevant topics. The list of faculty is furnished at Appendix F-XVIII.

Feedback

The participants were generally satisfied with the course which had fulfilled its objectives to a great extent, according to them. They were of the opinion that the duration of such courses should be longer. They expressed their pleasure on the quality of the lecture-discussion sessions and the choice of speakers. They suggested that such courses should also include elected representatives from urban local bodies.

The course was directed by Dr. Richa Varmani, Joint Director.

3. WORKSHOP ON OUR RIVERS: LINKING LIVES AND LIVELIHOODS

On the occasion of **World Ocean Day** a day-long workshop on this subject was organised in collaboration with the Centre for Environment Education, North Zone, Lucknow, on June 8, 2005. Various experts, environmentalists, planners, administrators, researchers, officials and academicians participated in these deliberations. Fortunately, two researchers from the University of Michigan, U.S.A. also graced the occasion. In all 35 persons participated in the workshop. The details are furnished of Annexure No. XXII.

The main objectives of this academic activity were to emphasize upon the conservation and preservation of surface water; to discuss the importance of rivers for human kind; to discuss the outcomes of interlinking of rivers in other parts of the world; to analyse its impact on flora and fauna; and to identify the probable problems and suggest the precautionary measures, before initiating such a project in the country.

The workshop was inaugurated by Prof.R.P.Singh, Vice Chancellor, Lucknow University. In his address the Chief Guest emphasized on conservation and effective management of water, especially surface water. Sri T.N.Dhar, Honourary Secretary, IIPA, U.P.Branch in his presidential remarks discussed the impact of linking Nile, Mississippi and Colorado rivers. It was unanimously recommeded that linking of rivers should be need-based, nature-based, eco-based and environment friendly.

The workshop was coordinated by Dr.U.B.Singh, Joint Director.

4. BUILDING MUNICIPAL CAPACITY THROUGH RESOURCE MOBILIZATION

This course was organized for the municipal officials of Uttar Pradesh from June 16th to 18th, 2005.

Objectives

The main objectives of the training were: to familiarize the participants with the characteristics of municipal finance, especially after the 74th CAA; sources of tax and non-tax revenue, their administration and related problems; Property tax reforms; review of accounting practices and budgetary procedures double entry system of accounting; building fiscal capacity of urban local bodies, and issues before the IIIrd State Finance Commission of the Government of Uttar Pradesh.

Participants

The programme was attended by twelve senior officers, who included Assistant Municipal Commissioners of Nagar Nigams and Executive Officers of Nagar Palika Parishads, besides Accounts Officers of Nagar Nigams of U.P. The list of participants is annexed at Annexure P-XXIII.

Faculty

Besides the Internal Faculty of the RCUES, the eminent guest faculty consisted of Sri R. Ramani, IAS, Principal Secretary, Department of Urban Development and Urban Poverty Alleviation, Government of U.P., Sri S.A.T. Rizvi (IAS, Retd.), Chairman IIIrd State Finance Commission, Government of U.P., Sri T.N. Dhar (IAS, Retd.), Chairman, IInd State Finance Commission, Government of U.P., and Sri S.B. Verma, Chief Finance and Accounts Officer, NEDA, Government of U.P.. The details are on Appendix F-XIX.

Feedback

They were satisfied with the conduct of the course and felt that they had benefited immensely from it. They were of unanimous opinion that the duration of the programme should be increased to a week. They also suggested that similar training should be conducted for other officers of the urban local bodies in order that its purpose may be more effective. They desired training on computerization of accounts too.

Group Report

The participants presented a Group Report wherein they suggested the ways to overcome the problems relating to municipal finances. Some of the main recommendations were, as follows: Property tax should be made compulsory, and the right of hearing objections should be given to officials of the local body and district administration; Magisterial powers should be given to executive officers for the recovery of municipal taxes and dues and in the case of removal of encroachments; The Municipal Board and the elected representatives should be made responsible if proposals for augmenting municipal revenue are turned down by the Board, consequently resulting in losses to the urban local bodies; The services of employees belonging to non-centralised services should be made transferable within the division; The Municipal Manual, 1952 should be up-dated; The double entry system of accounting should be introduced in urban local bodies and the concerned officials should be imparted training for the same; All the functions listed in the XIIth Schedule of the Constitution should be transferred to the urban local bodies; There should be a unified municipal act for all the categories of urban local bodies; The urban local bodies should be allowed to levy tax on installation of electricity and telephone poles, and payment of electrical dues on street lights should be borne by departments concerned with maintaining law and order.

The course was directed by Dr. Richa Varmani, Joint Director.

5. CAPACITY BUILDING FOR EFFICIENT FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT OF URBAN LOCAL BODIES

This training course was organized for the municipal officials of Uttar Pradesh from July 13th to 15th, 2005.

Objectives

The main objectives of the training programme were: To highlight the impact of 74th CAA on municipal finance; To acquaint the participants with the various issues of municipal taxation; To discuss the framing of rules and bye-laws for efficient financial management; To suggest ways to improve managerial resource mobilization capacities of urban local bodies; To familiarize the participants with the latest trends in municipal budgeting and accounting, especially double entry system; To discuss the importance of municipal audit and compliance of audit objections

Participants

The programme was attended by fourteen senior officers, including Executive Officers and Accountants of Nagar Nigams and Nagar Palika Parishads, Nagar Nigams of U.P. The list of participants is annexed at Annexure P - XXIV.

Faculty

Besides the internal faculty of the RCUES, the eminent guest faculty consisted of Smt.Shraddha Misra, Special Secretary, Department of Urban Development, Government of U.P.; Sri T.N. Dhar, (IAS, Retd.), Chairman, Ind State Finance Commission, Government of U.P.; Sri S.B. Verma, Chief Finance and Accounts Officer, NEDA, Government of U.P.; and Sri K.N. Tandon, Retd. Deputy Director, Local Fund Audit Department, Government of U.P.. The details are given on Appendix F-XX.

Sri Anil Kumar (IAS), Vice Chairman, Kanpur Development Authority presided over the Validictory Function; while Smt. Shraddha Misra, Special Secretary, Department of Urban Development, Government of Uttar Pradesh was the Chief Guest on the closing day of the programme and the distributed the certificates to the participants.

Sri Anil Kumar motivated the officials to think 'out of the box' conventional means, which would thereby lead to strengthening the civic resources of the civic bodies, and to provide world-class amenities to their citizens.

Feedback

All the participants were satisfied with the conduct of the course and felt that they had benefited immensely from it. They were highly appreciative of the course contents and the training material. They were of the unanimous opinion that the duration of the programme should be increased to a week. They also suggested that similar training should be conducted for the elected representatives and other officers of the urban local bodies in order that it may be more purposeful and effective. They desired training on computerization of accounts too and suggested that there should be a separate training programme on double entry system of accounting and general aspects of municipal administration.

The course was directed by Dr. Richa Varmani, Joint Director.

6. E-GOVERNANCE AND INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY FOR URBAN LOCAL BODIES

Keeping the importance of E-Governance and IT in view, the Regional Centre organized this three-day training programme from July 27th to 29th, 2005 for municipal officials of U.P.

Objectives

The objectives and specific contents of the course were as follows: to acquaint the participants with basics of Computer; to discuss the scope and computer application in municipal offices; to discuss the application of computer in Financial Management; to highlight the importance of computer application in GIS, MIS, FIS, E-Governance, etc.

Participants

The programme was attended by only four senior officers, who included an additional municipal commissioner, two assistant municipal commissioners and an assistant engineer from the urban local bodies and development authorities of U.P. The low level of participation was due to the transfers of almost three-fourths of the nominated officers, who had been posted out after the date of issuing of the nomination letter. The list of participants is enclosed at Annexure P-XXV.

Faculty

The guest faculty consisted of senior officers from the State Government, besides computer professionals, as well as the internal faculty of RCUES. The guest faculty included Sri A.K. Gupta, Chief Engineer, Directorate of Local Bodies, Government of U.P.; Sri R.K. Gupta, Senior Systems Manager, U.P. Development Systems Corporation (UPDESCO), Government of U.P.; Sri P.N. Ojha, Incharge of Computer Cell in Mirzapur Nagar Palika Parishad and Sri A.S.Chauhan, Consultant in HILTRON. The details are furnished on Appendix F-XXI.

Feedback and Suggestions

The participants were of the opinion that the course discussed the maximum topics, covering the various facets of E-Governance and IT in the short span of three days. The theoretical concept, principles and application of IT as a solution of good governance as well as the geographical mormation system (GIS) in Mirzapur Municipality were discussed to the verall satisfaction of the officers. They were of the view that the practical uses and methodology of computer applications in urban government should also be taught to them and that the course should be of at least one week's furation. They all felt that the same training should be conducted once again, so that the officers who had been transferred could also benefit from the same.

The course was directed by Dr. Richa Varmani, Joint Director.

FINANCE FOR NON-FINANCE EXECUTIVES 7.

A training programme on the subject was organized on September 7-9,2005.

Objectives

With a view to sensitising the non-finance executives of Nagar Panchayats of the State, on the various issues of financial administration and management, the Regional Centre for Urban and Environmental Studies (RCUES) organized the above mentioned training programme with the following specific objectives: to acquaint the non-finance executives with the need, importance and techniques of effective fiscal management and fiscal discipline; to stress upon the importance and preparation of realistic budget for fiscal management and control; to focus on the rules pertaining to accounting and auditing; to discuss the mobilization of financial resources in the context of 74th CAA.

Participants

The programme was attended by fourteen Executive Officers of Nagar Panchayats of the State of U.P. The list of participants is annexed at Annexure P-XXVI.

Faculty

The Guest Faculty included senior officials from the State Government and financial experts and consultants. However, the Faculty of the RCUES also presented their views and delivered lectures on the relevant topics. The guest faculty included Sri S.A.T. Rizvi (IAS Retd.), Chairman, IIIrd State Finance Commission, Government of U.P., Lucknow; Sri S.B. Verma, Chief Finance and Accounts Officer, Non-Conventional Energy Development Agency, Government of U.P.; Dr. B. C. Goel, Former Deputy Director in the Directorate of Local Bodies, Government of U.P.; Sri K.N. Tandon, Former Deputy Director, Local Fund Audit, Government of U.P. and Sri S.S. Srivastava, Financial Consultant.

Feedback and Suggestions

The participants were generally satisfied with the course which had fulfilled its objectives to a great extent, according to them. They were of the opinion that such courses should be of one week's duration. They expressed their overall satisfaction on the quality of the lecture-discussion sessions and the choice of speakers. They suggested that such courses should also include elected representatives from urban local bodies.

They were of the opinion that the sessions should include the use of computers also, in case the training programme was extended to a week's duration. They benefited greatly from the interactions they had with the guest faculty and core faculty of the Centre, since they discussed their various problems pertaining to financial management. They were all of the opinion that more courses on related issues and general municipal administration should be organized in future.

The course was directed by Dr. Richa Varmani, Joint Director.

RAIN WATER HARVESTING

This two-day training programme for municipal officials and engineers of urban local bodies of Uttar Pradesh was organized at Lucknow September 23 and 24, 2005.

Objectives

The main objectives of the training programme were as follows: to acquaint the participants with the grave situation arising out of the depleting ground water level; to highlight the need and importance of water conservation and augmentation of the ground water resources; to discuss the actions techniques of rain water harvesting; to emphasise upon the community and private sector participation in water conservation; and to familiarize the officials with the initiatives taken by other states/various agencies

Participants

The programme was attended by fifteen senior officers belonging to various urban local bodies – both Nagar Palika Parishads and Nagar Panchayats of Uttar Pradesh. They consisted of Junior Engineers and Executive Officers. The list of participants is annexed at Annexure-P-

Faculty

The eminent guest faculty included senior officials and scientists of the State Government as well as the internal faculty of the RCUES. The guest faculty included Sri R.S. Sinha, Senior Hydrologist of the Ground Water Department, Government of U.P. and Dr. P.K. Srivastava, Assistant Director of the Central Drug Research Institute, Lucknow, who discussed the technical aspects related to Rain Water Harvesting. The internal faculty consisted of Dr. Richa Varmani, Joint Director and Dr. Anjuli Mishra, Deputy Director who spoke on general aspects of the issue of rain water harvesting.

The Chief Guest at the Valedictory Session was Prof. R.S. Yadav, Pro-Vice Chancellor of Lucknow University, who distributed the certificates to the participants, besides stressing on the need and importance of rain water harvesting in our daily lives.



Feed Back

All the participants were very enthusiastic about having learnt the details and understanding the concept of water conservation and rainwater harvesting. Besides being satisfied to a great extent, they appreciated the contents of the course and were of the opinion that they had benefited immensely from the course. They felt that although they had been given the maximum input in a limited period of two days, they would have preferred if

the training programme was of a longer duration. They also suggested that site visits should be arranged in future, so that the practical aspects may be understood by greater detail. They all were of the view that all the engineers and officials of all the urban local bodies should be familiarized with the concept of water conservation, recharging of ground water, various techniques of roof-top harvesting and the role of the community and their participatory approach in solving the implementation problem of harnessing water to the maximum advantage of the residents in ever growing cities of today. They also felt rain water harvesting should be made mandatory by means of government policies and public awareness should be created.

The programme was directed by Dr. Richa Varmani, Joint Director.



9. COLLOQUIA ON NATIONAL URBAN RENEWAL MISSION (TWO)

The Centre organized two colloquia of one day each were organized on September 24 and 26, 2005, respectively.

Objectives

The main objectives of the Colloquia were: to highlight the background under which the NURM schemes are being launched; to bring forth the problem of concentration of population in larger urban areas and its impact on the provision of services; to discuss the impacts of other development schemes being/having been implemented in urban areas; to identify the grey areas in urban administration, in terms of legal, financial, administrative, organizational, functional etc.; to make the officers aware about the main ingredients of National Urban Renewal Mission and other Omnibus Schemes.

Participants

The participants included Additional Municipal Commissioners, Deputy/Asstt. Municipal Commissioners of all the 12 Municipal Corporations and Executive Officers of Nagar Palika Parishads. In all 52 officers participated in first colloquium held on September 24, 2005 and 33 in second colloquium held on September 26, 2005. The list of participating officials is seen as Annexure P-XXVIII.

Observations and Feedback

The programmes were well received by the officials of urban local bodies. They were very enthusiastic about the intervention. The participants expressed following observations for the successful implementation of the Mission programmes. These include: the implementation of the Mission programmes should be done by the urban local bodies. The other parastatal can just assist and guide the city government; the officials of urban local development authorities, jal sansthans, housing bodies. board. SUDA/DUDA etc. should be given 3 day orientation training unfailingly, followed by periodical refresher courses; the people's representatives should also be thoroughly oriented to these newly launched schemes; the Central assistance in NURM should be increased from 50 per cent to 70 per cent; the share of State/ULB in NURM should be clarified. It should be earmarked separately for both and be reduced; the share of beneficiaries in second submission should be reduced from 25 per cent to 10 per cent; the loan from financial institutions should be reduced from 30 to 15 per cent; the financing pattern thus should be as under: a)Sub-mission I - Centre: State: ULB: FIs as 70:10:5:15; b) Sub-mission II - Centre: State: ULB: Beneficiary as 70:15:5:10; the money earmarked for preparation of DPRs should be made available in advance either by the Centre or by the State Government; the funds allocated for capacity development should be released to training institute with the launch of scheme for proper and timely orientation; some fund should be made available for preparation of Perspective Plan and Development Plan as well; some preparatory time be allowed for preparing the plans; the State Resource Centre should be included as member to the State Sanctioning Committee/Steering Committee/Monitoring Committee.

The programmes were coordinated by Dr. U.B. Singh, Joint Director with the active support of Dr. Rajeev Narayan, Deputy Director.

10. MANAGEMENT OF URBAN SERVICES

This two-day training programme (with special reference to water supply and sewerage services) was organised for engineers of Jal Sansthans and urban local bodies of U.P. on October 21-22, 2005.



Objectives

The main objectives of the training programme were: to familiarize the participants with the need and importance of adequate urban infrastructure and overall impact of urbanization and related factors on the management of urban services; to discuss the process of planning and implementation of urban services projects and analyze the critical areas; to emphases upon the proper pricing policy and need of cost recovery; to highlight the need, role and importance of private sector and community participation in the provision of urban services.

Participants

The programme was attended by fourteen Junior Engineers, mostly from the Jal Sansthans and from Nagar Nigams and Nagar Palika Parishads of U.P. The list of participants is given in Annexure-P-XXIX.

Faculty

Both the internal faculty of the RCUES and guest faculty were involved in the lecture-discussion sessions of the programme. The guest faculty consisted of eminent specialists in the field viz. Sri R.K. Tripathi, General Manager of Lucknow Jal Sansthan, Sri U.S. Pande, Executive Engineer of the U.P. Jal Nigam and Sri R.K. Gupta, Senior Manager of the U.P. Development Systems Corporation (UPDESCO), Lucknow.

Feedback and Suggestions

The participating officers were of the opinion that they had all benefited from the lecture discussion sessions organised during the training. Although they were familiar with its contents, they felt that the training programme had provided them with a better insight into the various managerial aspects of water supply and sewerage systems as they learnt a lot about the latest concepts and issues relating to the various topics within the limited time framework. They felt that the course should be of 3-4 days' duration. They were of the opinion that field visits would also be beneficial as part of the training course. All of them appreciated the discussions relating to information and communication technology and rain water harvesting. They also expressed the desire that financial powers should be vested with the water works engineers working in Nagar Palika Parishads. They were unanimous in expressing their deep sense of satisfaction with the conduct of the course, and felt that more such training programmes should be organized in future also. The course was directed by Dr. Richa Varmani, Joint Director.

11. PLANNING AND IMPLEMENTATION OF LOW COST HOUSING PROJECTS

A two-day training programme on the subject was organised on October 26-27, 2005 for the engineers of urban local bodies of Uttar Pradesh.

Objectives

The specific objectives of the course were as follows: To discuss scope and importance of low cost housing; To highlight the low cost design materials and construction techniques; To identify the shortcomings and suggest remedial methods.

Participants

There were fourteen engineers from urban local bodies, mainly municipal corporations and development authorities from U.P., who attended the course. The list of participants is shown at Annexure P-XXX.

Faculty

Besides the internal faculty, the eminent guest faculty consisted of ST A.K. Gupta, Chief Engineer in the Directorate of Local Bodies, Government of U.P., Sri Thomas Antony, Assistant Chief of Housing and Urbar Development Corporation (HUDCO), Sri S.B. Verma, Chief Finance and Accounts Officer, Non-Conventional Energy Development Agency (NEDA), Government of U.P. and Sri Vinod Dhaon, an eminent Architect Prof. R.P. Singh, Vice-Chancellor, Lucknow University and Chairman Governing Council of RCUES, Lucknow was the Chief Guest at the Valedictory Function and addressed the participants and distributed certificates to them.



Feedback and Suggestions

The participating officers expressed their immense satisfaction with the conduct of the programme and its contents. They were of the view that this training covered almost all aspects of low cost building technology and alternative materials, as well as formulation, implementation and design of low-cost housing projects and their financial aspects, even in its short duration. They were impressed with all the speakers and expressed their pleasure with the contents of the training material. They suggested that a field visit to the sites would have been beneficial, and hoped that more such courses should be organized in future.

12. WORKSHOP ON JAWAHARLAL NEHRU NATIONAL URBAN RENEWAL MISSION

A day-long workshop on newly launched scheme on Jawaharlal Nehru National Urban Renewal Mission (JNNURM) was organized on December 10, 2005. This was the first such workshop after the formal launch of the scheme by the Prime Minister on 3rd December, 2005, though a number of such training programmes to orient officials on the scheme based on Draft Guidelines were organized in all the constituent states.

Objectives

The main objectives of the workshop were: to acquaint the decision makers about the official guidelines of the new scheme; to highlight the urban scenario in Uttar Pradesh and the impact of growing urbanization on urban infrastructure and services; to discuss the trend of concentration of population in larger urban areas especially in the towns selected under the new scheme; to brainstorm all the concerned officials/decision makers; to identify the role of different government departments and agencies responsible for functions/services covered under the JNNURM; to chalk out a strategy for initiating the implementation process in the state; to identify the probable gray areas expected to crop in the implementation process; to provide a forum for brainstorming among all the players (concerned officials) involved in the decision making process; to identify the role of the State Government, Nodal Agency, Urban Local Bodies and the Parastatals for the successful implementation of the JNNURM.

Participants

Being the first exposure workshop after the formal launch of the scheme, the decision makers at the apex level from all the concerned government departments were invited. The Chief Secretary of the State himself took the initiative for holding such an exposure workshop and he made a point to grace the occasion for almost whole day. The invitees included Industrial Development Commissioner, Principal Secretaries of the Departments of Energy, PWD, Tourism, Housing and Urban Planning, Irrigation, Transport, Environment, Urban Development, Urban Employment and Poverty Alleviation, Non-conventional Energy, Social Welfare, Health and Education besides Directors of Urban Local Bodies and SUDA, Managing Director, Jal Nigam, Chief Town & Country Planner, Vice Chairmen and Secretaries of the Development Authorities and the Municipal Commissioners of the towns selected under the scheme, and the General Managers of the respective Jal Sansthans. Thus, the highest decision makers and chief executives of all the concerned departments and agencies were invited.

In all 44 officers including Secretaries, Special Secretaries, Joint Secretaries, Deputy/Under Secretaries, Directors, Municipal Commissioners, Engineers, Planners, General Managers and experts attended the Workshop and enriched the deliberations. The list of participants is furnished at Annexure P-XXXI.

Inauguration

This high level Workshop was inaugurated by Sri R. Ramani, Chief Secretary to the Government of Uttar Pradesh by lighting the customary lamp. Earlier Prof. Nishith Rai, Director, RCUES welcomed the chief guest and other delegates. In his welcome address Prof. Rai introduced the subject for discussion. He said that this reform-linked scheme for developing urban infrastructure mandates the people's participation in the delivery and maintenance of basic urban services. He welcomed this new initiative of the Union Government for the city development.

Presentations and Proceedings

The whole proceedings were divided in three parts. Dr. U.B. Singh, Joint Director, RCUES discussed at length the needs and importance of launching the JNNURM. Elaborating the context he said that the increase in urban population during the last century had been tremendous. While total population of the country grew less than four times and increase in rural population was three folds, urban population recorded a growth of eleven times. Dr. Singh said that while there was only one town in 1901 with the population of 10 lakhs, the number rose to 5 in 1951 and 35 in 2001. Dr. Singh apprised that according to 2001 Census, 38 per cent of total urban population in the country is inhabited in these 35 metro cities, and 31 per cent is living in remaining 658 towns having population of one lakh and more, the balance 31 per cent of urban population is scattered in the remaining about 4500 towns spread over the country.

While presenting the scenario of U.P. he highlighted that about 57 per cent of urban population in the state is concentrated in 50 towns having a population of more than one lakh, whereas all the 52 urban centres with the same population account for about 62 per cent of total urban population. Dr. Singh quoting the figures said that urban growth rate during the last decade (1991-2001) in the State was 2.98 per cent which was more than the national growth of 2.75 per cent. The 12 Corporation towns in State combinedly share 37 per cent of urban population and more than 64 per cent of population concentred in Class I towns. He said that the 7 towns selected under JNNURM pocket 27 per cent of total urban population and 48 per cent of Class I population. The urbanization in the country as well as in U.P., according to him is characterized of the State by the concentration of population in larger urban centres. This is stressing severely the urban infrastructure.

Discussing the conditions of municipalities Dr. Singh said that per capita expenditure (Rs. 273.29) of ULBs in U.P. is more than per capital

receipt (Rs. 263.53). The per capita expenditure in Municipal Corporations (Rs. 341.29) is more than their per capita receipt of Rs. 325.17. The ULBs in U.P. earn less than one fourth of their income from their own sources. Surprisingly, expenditure by ULBs on core services is found as Rs. 43.70 per capita only as against the same of Rs. 78.91 by Municipal Corporations. Thus, the ULBs are not able even to maintain the existing urban infrastructure.

Further Dr. Singh said that the governmental interventions have been sectoral. The urban development strategy has been swinging between sum/environment, improvement and without infrastructural development in cities and community development. The whole development strategy has been found failed miserably because of lacking coordination and convergence at the implementation level although focusing on improvement to development to empowerment.

The next presentation on the schemes was made by Sri S.P. Singh, Special Secretary to the U.P. Government in the Department of Urban Development. His presentation was comprehensive and a planned one. First of all he presented the demographic characteristics of urban India and their impact on urban infrastructure and services. In second part of his presentation he elaborated on the components, elements, mission strategies, financing pattern, urban reforms and other provisions of all the four schemes with special focus on JNNURM. In third part of his presentation Sri Singh detailed out the U.P. scenario related to urbanization, status of urban services, situational analysis of municipalities etc. In last part he presented the proposed institutional strategies for the successful implementation of NNURM.

After the presentation, the house was opened for discussion. The main interventionists included Sri Rajan Shukla, Secretary, Finance, Sri A.K. Singh, Secretary, Irrigation, Sri Sanjay Bhoosreddy, Secretary, Non-Conventional Energy, Sri Diwakar Tripathi, Director, SUDA, Sri B.B. Singh, Vice-Chairman, LDA, Sri R.A. Khan, General Manager, Jal Sansthan, Allahabad, Sri N.R. Verma, Chief Town Planner, Sri D.C. Mishra, Secretary, Urban Development, Sri Bhuanesh Kumar, Special Secretary, Urban Development among others.

Recommendations

After a long discussion following points emerged as recommendations:

1. The **State Steering Committee** under the Chairmanship of Hon'ble Chief Minister should be reconstituted as per the need of the State.

Further, the Sanctioning and Monitoring Committee (under **UIDSSMT**) should be rechristened as **Coordination**, **Sanctioning and Monitoring Committee** (under the chairmanship of Principal Secretary, UD) should be empowered to cover all the schemes i.e. JNNURM, UIDSSMT and IHSDP. As such, the committee was reconstituted with widened coverage and power.

- 2. Since JNNURM covers activities pertaining to many departments there is a need for coordinating the efforts. Hence, a Top **Management Group** under the chairmanship of Chief Secretary should be constituted. The other members of the Group should be Principal Secretary of Urban Development, Urban Employment and Poverty Alleviation, Transport, Housing and Urban Planning, Environment and Director, State Resource Centre. The proposals/projects examined by the Group should only be placed before the Steering Committee.
- 3. An **Expert Group** under the Top Management Group should be created under the convenorship of Director, State Resource Centre. The other members may include the Member Secretary of the Top Management Group, Subject Experts from IIT, IIM, Universities, Community besides the core faculty of the RCUES. This expert group shall provide specialised inputs to the Top Management Group.
- 4. A **Committee at the District Level** under the Chairmanship of District Magistrate may be constituted. The other members may include representatives of ULB, Development Authority, Jal Nigam, Housing Board, Town & Country Planning, Energy, P.W.D. etc. The Committee shall give a final shape to CDPs and DPRs.
- 5. The Town and Country Planning Department should be entrusted the job of preparing the Perspective Plan. It may take the help of private experts and other departments.

- 6. The concerned ULBs should be empowered to develop CDP of the selected towns. The ULBs should prepare CDP with the help of State Resource Centre, other departments and private experts.
- 7. U.P. Jal Nigam, which has been identified as Technical Agency for preparing DPRs should prepare DPRs on priority basis as per CDP requirement. It may take help from other departments and private experts.
- 8. Directorate of Urban Local Bodies should be empowered and strengthened. The technocrats, planners and other experts should be attached thereto. The Director of Local Bodies should function as Nodal Agency. While acting as Nodal Agency, it should take the help of State Resource Centre, SUDA, Jal Nigam etc.
- 9. For integration in planning and implementing under JNNURM, there is a need to establish coordination between departments of Urban Development, Urban Employment and Poverty Alleviation, Housing and Urban Planning, Environment and Transport. Hence the post of 'Urban Development Commissioner' should be raised and a senior official should be entrusted the job of maintaining coordination between all the concerned departments at the government decision making level.
- 10. There is an urgent need to expose the officials of various departments e.g. Urban Development, Urban Employment and Poverty Alleviation, Housing and Urban Planning, Environment, Transports etc. Hence a comprehensive **Training and Capacity Development Plan** should be developed by the State Resource Centre and the training programmes organised on priority basis accordingly. For the purpose, a special grant should be made available to the State Resource Centre at the earliest.
- 11. The State Resource Centre should organise intensive training programmes for the concerned officials on CDP and DPR on priority basis.

- 12. The State Government should constitute MPC and DPC and make them functional at the earliest, as per spirit of the supreme law of the land
- 13.Urban Local Bodies should be made the implementing agency. The other service providing agencies should assist them for successful implementation of the schemes.
- 14.The shares of State Government and ULBs should be allocated through State Budget. The State Government should make sufficient budget provision for the purpose.
- 15. The Municipal Corporation Act, 1959, Municipalities Act, 1916, Rent Control Act, Urban Planning and Development Act, Water Supply and Sewerage Act and other related laws should be suitably amended to bring gradually all the service providing agencies under the umbrella of ULB and also to associate/empower elected representatives with the city planning process.
- 16.Every efforts should be made to associate the community with the provision and maintenance of services.
- 17.Special emphasis should be laid on the provision of services and development of infrastructure in areas inhabited by urban poor.

Valediction

The programme ended with a valedictory address by the Chief Secretary. In his address he welcomed the outcome of fruitful discussions and assured special attention towards their implementation. Sri Ramani exhorted the officials to work for the upliftment of poor and the provision of infrastructural services in the city in a holistic manner with special focus on urban poor. He highlighted the importance and need of associating the community in asset creation and maintenance and asked the officials to involve community and people's representatives in all developmental works.

The vote of thanks was proposed by Sri D.C. Mishra, Secretary to U.P. Government in the Department of Urban Development.

13. ORIENTATION WORKSHOPS ON JNNURM, UIDSSMT & IHSDP (THREE)

In fulfillment of the desire of the state government of Uttar Pradesh, the Centre oriented the Executive Officers of all the towns with population more than 50,000 on the Jawaharlal Nehru National Urban Renewal Mission (JNNURM) and Urban Infrastructure Development for Small & Medium Towns (UIDSSMT) and Integrated Housing and Slum Development Programme (IHSDP). These three workshops of one day each were organised on January 18, 19 and 20, 2006.

Objectives

The main objectives of the workshops were: to acquaint the officials with the increasing urban population and stress on urban services; to discuss the urban development strategies since Independence and to identify the short comings in the government interventions; to highlight the main provisions of JNNURM, UIDSSMT and IHSDP; to emphasize on the need of developing small and medium towns; to discuss the importance, need and echniques for preparing CDP and DPRs; to identify the areas for PPP in the provision of urban services; to suggest the ways and means to get maximum and benefits from the Central Schemes.

Participants

The programmes were attended by Municipal Commissioners/ Additional Municipal Commissioners of all the Nagar Nigams and Executive Officers of all the Nagar Palika Parishads of having population of 50,000 or above. About 62 officers attended on 18th January, 62 on 19th January and 48 on 20th January 2006. In all 172 officers were oriented. The details are furnished at Annexure P-XXXII.

Faculty

The faculty for these programmes was drawn from the core faculty of the Centre. The representatives of State Government, SUDA and Directorate of Urban Local Bodies also enriched the deliberations.

All these workshops were coordinated by Dr. U.B. Singh, Joint Director in association with Dr. Rajeev Narayan, Deputy Director.
14. ORIENTATION WORKSHOP ON JNNURM

A day-long workshop was organized on January 21, 2006 to orient the members of the Executive Committee of Lucknow Nagar Nigam and its officials. In all 55 elected members, officers headed by Mayor Dr. S.C. Rai and acting Municipal Commissioner Sri Santosh Rai participated in the deliberations.

The presentation on JNNURM was made by Dr. U.B. Singh, Joint Director. In his presentations he dwelt in detail about the JNNURM strategy. Dr. Singh convinced the Executive Members which unanimously resolved to go for launching this new scheme in Lucknow.

The workshop was coordinated by Dr. U. B. Singh, Joint Director.

15. PLANNING FOR HEALTHY CITY

Keeping the importance of environmental issues in mind, a three-day training programme was organized on the subject, the first of its kind, from January 23-25, 2006 for the municipal officials of the State of Uttar Pradesh.

Objectives

The main objectives of the training programme were as follows: to sensitize the officials towards integrated health, sanitation and urban waste management in cities; to emphasize on the proper handling of bio-medical wastes; to discuss on the various aspects of urban environment management; to sensitize the participants regarding communicable diseases and AIDS.

Participants

The programme was attended by 20 senior officers, who included Assistant Municipal Commissioners of Nagar Nigams and Executive Officers of various Nagar Palika Parishads of U.P. The list of participants is annexed at Annexure -P-XXXIII.

Faculty

Besides the internal faculty of the RCUES, the eminent guest faculty consisted of Dr. Sulabha Swaroop, Assistant Project Director, SIFPSA, and Dr. M.M. Murtaza, Joint Director, Medical and Health Services, Government of Uttar Pradesh. The Panel Discussion was jointly presided by Sri S.A.T. Rizvi, Senior Bureaucract and Chairman, IIIrd State Finance Commission, Government of Uttar Pradesh and Sri S.P. Singh, Special Secretary of the Urban Development Department, Government of U.P.

Feedback and Suggestions

All the participants were extremely satisfied with the conduct of the course and were very enthusiastic about learning the various issues relating general health of the citizens, especially the details of management of hospital waste and communicable diseases. They were of the opinion that the duration of the course should be increased to 5 or 6 days. They even suggested that study tours should be conducted to foreign countries and ther states within the country to facilitate advanced information on the subject.

The course was directed by Dr. Richa Varmani, Joint Director and Dr. Anjuli Mishra, Dy. Director was the Co-Course Director.

16. WORKSHOP ON JNNURM

A day-long workshop on JNNURM was organized on January 24, 2006 at Kanpur. The main objective was to orient the officials of Kanpur Nagar Nigam, NGOs, members of civil society, District Officials to the newly launched scheme on JNNURM.

About 70 participants enriched the deliberations. The workshop was mangurated by Smt. Anita Bhatnagar Jain, Commissioner of Kanpur Division and was closed with the remarks of Sri R.N. Trivedi, IAS, Director-General, State Institute of Rural Development, Lucknow. The workshop graced by the District Magistrate, the Municipal Commissioner and Sri SP. Singh, Special Secretary, Urban Development Department, Government U.P. and Prof. Nishith Rai, Director, RCUES among others.

The main presentation was made by Dr. U.B. Singh, Joint Director. He dwelt in length the objectives, strategy, steps, financing pattern reform agenda etc. under the scheme.

The workshop was coordinated by Dr. U.B. Singh, Joint Director.

17. TWO WORKSHOPS ON UIDSSMT & IHSDP

Two workshops of one-day each on Urban Infrastructure Development Scheme for Small & Medium Towns (UIDSSMT) and Inegrated Housing & Slum Development Programme (IHSDP) were organized by the Centre on Februrary 14 & 15, 2006.

Objectives

The main objectives of the Workshop were: to acquaint the District Officers with the need and importance of developing infrastructure in small and medium towns; to enlighten them with the salient features of UIDSSMT & IHSDP; to prepare the strategy for implementation of these schemes.

Participants

The District Magistrates of all the 53 districts covered under first phase for infrastructure development under UIDSSMT and IHSDP, Municipal Commissioners of 6 towns having municipal corporation and officials from other departments were nominated.

The participants included the District Magistrates, Municipal Commissioners, Additional Municipal Commissioners, Executive Officers, Planners, Engineers and other officials.

In all 51 officers attended the workshop on 14th February and 42 officers participated in the workshop held on February 15, 2006. Thus in all 30 District Magistrates, 12 ADMs / CDOs, 9 Municipal Commissioners / Additional Municipal Commissioners / Executive Officers and 27 district officers besides officers from other departments were exposed to both the schemes. The details are furnished at Annexure XXXIV.

Inauguration

The workshop has inaugurated by Sri Mohd. Azam Khan, Hon'ble Minister for Urban Development, Urban Employment & Poverty Alleviation and Parliamentary Affairs, Government of Uttar Pradesh. In his inaugural address the chief guest stressed on integrated development of rural and urban areas. He said the past experience has not been encouraging and satisfactory. The sectoral and area based programmes led to unwieldy development which failed to impact development in small and median towns. Now, the Government has launched programmes simultaneously for all the towns but the development of urban areas will attract more migration from rural areas. Hence an integrated development strategy for the whole state (urban and rural) is the need of the hour.

Sri R. Ramani, Chief Secretary to U.P. Government and guest of honour exhorted the officials for efficient and timely implementation of these schemes for getting more and more benefits of central assistance. He said money should not be a hindrance.

Sri D.C. Mishra, Secretary to U.P. Government in the Department of Urban Development welcomed all the recently launched schemes for infrastructure development. He said even though CDP is not a pre-requisite for DPRs under UIDSSMT and IHSDP, it is better to prepare the DPRs under broad canvas.

Sri A.K. Srivastava, Secretary, Housing and Urban Planning highlighted the reform actions regarding reservation of plots/houses to the une of 15% in all the housing colonies, provision for rainwater harvesting etc. taken by the Government. He said that land may not be a problem.

JAWAHARLAL NEHRU NATIONAL URBAN RENEWAL MISSION

The Regional Centre has been designated by the Governent of Uttar Pradesh as the **State Resource Centre** for the Jawaharlal Nehru National Urban Renewal Mission (JNNURM) which is the largest ever initiative taken by the Government of India in the urban sector.

The two Sub-Missions envisaged under the JNNURM focus on Urban Infrastructure and Governance' and 'Basic Services for the Urban Poor' respectively. The Mission with a budgetary provision for Rs. 50,000 crore for a period of seven years, shall provide grant assistance to the cities for carrying out the specified activities.

The Regional Centre, Lucknow as 'State Resource Centre' has been entrusted with wide ranging responsibilities in connection with JNNURM. The Centre organized various sensitization workshops etc. for various stakeholders at various levels.

Since formulation of City Development Plan (CDP) was the foremost prerequisite for accessing funds under Mission, the Centre facilitated and monitored the preparation of CDP for all seven cities of U.P. viz. Lucknow, Kanpur, Allahabad, Agra, Varanasi, Meerut and Mathura identified under Mission. The procurement of suitable and expert consultant for each city was the important step in this direction. After preparing TOR and related documents, letter of invitation was sent to 29 consultancy organisations empanelled by the MOUD, GOI for preparation of CDP for the identified cities along with TOR and relevant documents.

A Pre-bid meeting was thereafter organized in response to the puerries/classifications sought by the consultants. Minor modifications were carried out in TOR after deliberations and consensus of representatives of the consultancy firms that participated in the Pre-bid Meeting. Minutes of the Pre-bid Meeting were sent to all the empanelled consultancy organizations.

The proposals submitted by consultancy firms were scrutinized and evaluated by the Sub-Committee constituted for the purposes in accordance with the parameters defined in TOR. The processed documents thus prepard, were placed before Evaluation Committee constituted under the with the parameters defined in TOR. The processed documents thus prepard, were placed before Evaluation Committee constituted under the Chairmanship of Secretary, Department of Urban Development, Govt. of U.P. on the matter. Evaluation Committee after carefully deliberating on the proposals of the shortlisted technically qualified consultancy firms, awarded the consultancy assignments to the lowest financial bidder for preparation of CDP.

In addition, comprehensive formats were also developed for collection of basic data relating to the admissible components under JNNURM and were sent to the concerned departments/agencies which were essentially required for preparation of CDPs under JNNURM.

All the above mentioned activities were jointly performed by Dr. Urmila Bagga, Joint Director and Dr. K. Sreeram, Consultant in the Centre.

2. Plantation Programme

The Government of Uttar Pradesh has initiated the planting of saplings in every premise with a view to make urban areas green. As such the RCUES organized a Plantation Programme on July 29, 2005 at its

Singh, Vice-Chancellor of Lucknow University suggested to plant fruit-giving trees. The occasion was graced amongst others by Dr. Navneet Sehgal, Director, Ministry of Panchayati Raj, Government of India, Sri D.C. Mishra, Secretary, Urban Development, Sri R.N. Tripathi, District Magistrate, Lucknow, Smt. Alka Srivastava, Director of Local Bodies, Sri V.K. Paťnaik, Princial Chief Conservator of Forest, Prof. R.S. Yadav, Pro-Vice Chancellor, Lucknow University, besides a number of other government officers, students of many schools, members of civil society etc. In his welcome address Prof. Nishith Rai, Director of the Centre dwelt on the importance of protecting urban environment and the role of RCUES in this regard. Dr. U.B. Singh, Joint Director proposed the vote of thanks. Dr. Anjuli, Deputy Director conducted the proceedings.

SPONSORED PROGRAMMES

1. TRAINING PROGRAMME ON BSUP AND IHSDP (TWO)

Nevertheless, it is also imperative that those who would implement mission have not only knowledge about the mission but also develop uate skills and attitudes to implement it with commitment. This was the objective of the two three day training programmes entitled "NURM Scheme under the Ministry of Urban Employment and Poverty viation (IHSDP)" were conducted by the Regional Centre. The mes were sponsored by the State Urban Development Agency DA), Uttar Pradesh for the Project Officers and Assistant Project cers and technical staff of sponsoring organization. The programmes organized on November 28-30, 2005 and December 1-3, 2005.

Participants

RESEARCH STUDIES/ CONSULTANCY

Comparison of Cantonment Board and Nagar Nigam: A Case Study of Lucknow

Municipal Corporations and Cantonment Boards are different forms of local bodies which render civic services to the residents of their respective areas. Yet the level of service offered by both these organizations shows wide disparities.

A research study to compare and contrast the functioning of these two types of organisations with special reference to the Lucknow Cantonment Board and Lucknow Municipal Corporation was carried out by the Regional Centre for Urban and Environmental Studies, Lucknow.

The broad objectives of the study were to compare the composition and administrative set-up, including the powers and duties of the various functionaries, their various obligatory and discretionary functions in the light of their respective Acts, various issues of financial management, their resource management and financial performance. The civic and social welfare services and those relating to public safety and other important aspects, the regulatory and control mechanism, as well as the system of penalty and appeals are also examined in the present study.

A comparison of the working of the Lucknow Municipal Corporation and Lucknow Cantonment Board brings out the broad differences as well as similarities in the working of these two different forms of urban local bodies which perform similar functions.

According to the Seventh Schedule of the Constitution of India, Parliament is the competent legislature to make laws in respect of Cantonment Boards, and they are a subject of the Union List. On the other hand, the subject of local self government and thus Municipal Corporations falls under the State List.

An examination of the administration of the Lucknow Cantonment Board in general reveals four major constituents, namely, the Government of India, the General Officer Commanding-in-Chief of the Command, the local military authorities of the Cantonment Board and the elected representatives of the residents. The executive authority at the Cantonment Board level is the Chief Executive Officer under the control of the Ministry of Defence. However, the Lucknow Municipal Corporation has a truly democratic set-up with a large number of elected C/l headed by the Mayor and the Municipal Commissioner, along with other officers.

The Cantonments Act, like any other Municipal Act, has provisions conferring the Lucknow Cantonment Board with the powers of taxation, control, powers in the interest of public safety, provisions relating to sanitation, prevention of disease, providing water supply, drainage and lighting, running hospitals and dispensaries, educational institutions etc. The performance of these activities is generally of a higher order considering the smaller population the Cantonment Board has to cater to, and its disciplined style of functioning.

However, in the case of Lucknow Municipal Corporation, with the inclusion of additional municipal functions in the Twelfth Schedule of the Constitution of India, the demands on municipal finance have increased and at the same time there is a need for upgrading the existing level of services. There is also a need to recognize the importance of financial and accounting reforms as parts of good governance. A beginning has been made in this direction as Lucknow is one of the cities that has been selected under the Jawaharlal Nehru National Urban Renewal Mission recently launched by the Government of India. Necessary policy and administrative deisions have to be taken by the Lucknow Municipal Corporation to strengthen its resource base in order to enhance its existing capacity. It has been recommended that a clue can be taken from the Lucknow Cantonment Board, which has a larger proportion of its revenue income from non-tax sources as compared to the tax sources, to the extent that it is a financially viable institution.

The study was conducted jointly by Dr. Richa Varmani, Joint Director and Dr. Anjuli Mishra, Deputy Director.

CONSULTANCY

1. Draft Urban Policy for the State of Uttar Pradesh

There is an unprecedented shift of human settlements to the cities in the developing countries and the same phenomenon is being witnessed in India. In fact, India is witnessing a rapid pace of urbanization and is recognized as one of the fastest growing urbanizing countries in the world. The increasing pace of urbanization creates a constant pressure on providers of essential urban services. Thus the urban government institutions have to strengthen their organizations, resources and capacities to deliver essential civic services like roads, sanitation, drinking water, waste disposal, sewerage and drainage facilities, street lighting, recreational areas etc. All these problems need to be tackled in a holistic manner and require the formulation of a comprehensive state level policy, with a vision of a progressive, dynamic and inclusive civic society.

It is proposed that the urban policy may be initially implemented in the following areas in order to tackle the vicious cycle of ever increasing population, poverty, pollution of the environment and paucity of municipal resources:

- 1. Expansion of services;
- 2. Eradication of poverty;
- 3. Environmental upgradation;
- 4. Enforcement of rules
- 5. Empowerment of community
- 6. Equity and Equality
- 7. Enlargement of Financial Resource Base
- 8. E-Governance and
- 9. Capacity Building

The Policy in English was drafted jointly by Dr. Richa Varmani, Joint Director and Dr. Anjuli Mishra Deputy Director with inputs from all, other faculty members.

A Draft Policy in Hindi was prepared by Dr. U.B. Singh Joint Director. It was presented before the officels of Urban Development.

2. Restructuring Urban Management in Jharkhand

The newly created state of Jharkhand approached the RCUES, Lucknow to guide the state government in developing institutional framework for urban management. Jharkand was carved out of Bihar in 2000 and thus inherited the urban institutional structure of the parent state. All the urban enactments of Bihar were adopted, which were felt not suitable to accomplish the development objectives of the new state. The Regional Centre happily offered its consultancy services.

After a thorough study of laws and the extensive discussions with official at different levels, the three tier institutional framework was proposed-Headquarter (government) level, Regional level, and City level. At the apex, Department of Urban Development is the policy maker. There will be a Directorate of Municipal Administration to serve as a bridge between state government and the urban local bodies. The State Urban Development Agency is created to provide technical input to urban local bodies in implementing the urban poverty alleviation and slum development programmes. The Town & Country Planning Organisation is made responsible for planned development of urban areas. The Directorate of Municipal Administration and Town & Country Planning Organisation will have their regional offices as well, whereas State Urban Development Agency will have District Urban Development Agency in every district. The municipality will have many units therein.

Besides proposing institutional structure and personnel requirement, the municipality-wise personnelization has also been suggested. The qualifications, pay structure, codification, and promotional avenue have also been framed. The roles and responsibilities and work – norms for field level functionaries have also been suggested.

The Government of Jharkhand has accepted the report and is in the process of implementation.
