#### About Us

The Regional Centre for Urban and Environmental Studies (RCUES) came into existence in the Lucknow University in the year 1968 established and supported by the Government of India in the Ministry of Urban Development. The Union Ministry of Urban Development in the year 2000 entered into an Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the University of Lucknow and since then the RCUES, Lucknow is being run under the joint guidance, supervision and control of the Lucknow University and the Ministry of Urban Development. It is one of the four such Centres in the country and has earned national and international recognition for playing a pivotal role in the activities which are organized under four interrelated programmes: training, research, teaching, consultancy services and dessemination of information relating to the urban sector in the unique collaboration and cooperation with the states of Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Bihar, Orissa, Madhya Pradesh, Jharkhand and Chhattisgarh.

#### Jurisdiction

The RCUES is responsible for building and developing capacity, policy research input, consultancy in the States of Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, Madhya Pradesh, Orissa, Jharkhand, Chhatisgarh and Uttarakhand. The target group consists of the officials and people's representatives, community members etc. engaged in urban local bodies, development authorities, water institutions, housing boards, NGOs, CBOs etc. in the states falling under its jurisdiction.

#### Infrastructure

The RCUES, Lucknow is situated on the left bank of the river Gomti, which provides a picturesque view to the campus. It has a well equipped conference hall, meeting room, rooms for the faculty and the office. The Centre has a fully furnished Training Hostel-cum-Guest House for the officials and people's representatives participating in the different activities organized by it.

A new campus well equipped with modern facilities as well as with residential accommodation is also being developed by the Centre.

#### Library

The RCUES, Lucknow has developed a library within its own campus. It has on its shelves about 5000 titles on almost all aspects dealing with urban development, management, environment, community development, urban health, slum improvement, water supply and sanitation etc. It also subscribes to

a large number (more than three dozens) of leading national and international journals associated with the subject.

#### Publication

The RCUES regularly brings out

- A bi-annual bi-lingual journal titled URBAN PANORAMA, and
- > NEWSLETTER being published quarterly.

In addition, the papers presented at seminars organized, and the report of the research studies, undertaken by the RCUES are also published in book form.

#### **Funding**

The RCUES receives regular financial support in the form of non-plan grants-in-aid from the Government of India in the Ministry of Urban Development. The State Government of Uttar Pradesh, a major beneficiary, also gives regular non-plan grant. The other constituent states also extend a helping hand occasionally.

#### Management

The functioning of the RCUES, Lucknow is guided by an MOU entered by the Union Ministry of Urban Development with the University of Lucknow. The rules governing the RCUES are consistent with the rules and regulations of the Lucknow University and guidelines issued from time to time by the Ministry.

#### Remarkable Achievements of the Centre

#### > STATE RESOURCE CENTRE FOR JNNURM

The Regional Centre has been appointed as the State Resource Centre (SRC) for JNNURM by the Government of Uttar Pradesh. The Centre in its capacity of SRC was entrusted with the preparation of CDPs of the seven identified cities of U.P. under JNNURM viz. Lucknow, Kanpur, Agra, Allahabad, Varanasi, Meerut and Mathura. All the CDPs of these 7 Mission cities of U.P. prepared under the guidance and technical inputs of the Regional Centre have been approved by the Ministry of Urban Development, Government of India.

- > Centre appointed as Nodal Agency for SWM in U.P. by Government of U.P.
- Centre appointed as Nodal Agency for implementation, monitoring and supervision of Double Entry Accounting System (DEAS) in all the 628 ULBs of U.P. by the Department of Urban Development, Government of U.P.

- RCUES has been appointed as Nodal Agency for implementation, monitoring and supervision of Geographical Information System (GIS) and Computerisation in the Nagar Nigams of Allahabad, Varanasi, Aligarh, Bareilly, Meerut, Moradabad, Jhansi and Nagar Palika Prishads of Firozabad, Faizabad, Fatehpur, Mau, Jaunpur, Ballia, Bijnore, Vrindaban, Haldaur (Bijnor), Shahjahanpur and Hapur.
- RCUES has been appointed as the State Level Agency for GOI-UNDP's "Capacity Development for Decentralized Urban Governance Project". Under this Project four towns of U.P. viz. Allahabad, Varanasi, Meerut and Mathura have been selected. The RCUES as State Level Agency is implementing Accounting Reforms through Double Entry System of Accounting and Property Tax Reforms through implementation of Geographical Information System (GIS). In this regard a UNDP Cell has been set up at RCUES.

## National Seminars

Management of Indian System of Medicine and Dynamics of Life Style

## National Seminar Management of Indian System of Medicine and Dynamics of Life Style

A two-day National seminar on "Management of Indian Systems of Medicine and Dynamics of Life Style" was organized by SRISHTI, Lucknow in collaboration with Ananya Institute of Development Research & Social Action, Lucknow and Regional Centre for Urban and Environmental Studies (RCUES), Lucknow on 10th and 11th June, 2006. It was sponsored by the Planning Commission, Government of India, New Delhi.

#### **Proceedings in Brief**

Prof. Nityanand, Former Director, Central Drug Research Institute, Lucknow, inaugurated the seminar while welcome address was given by Prof. S.K. Singh, President of Ananya Institute of Development Research and Social Action. Mr. Jitendra Varma, the President of SRISHTI gave a brief background of SRISHTI and presented a brief of the national seminar.

Dr. A.K. Singh, Asstt. Director of the RCUES, presented thematic issues of the seminar besides giving the background paper, the rationale, objectives and theoretical perspective.

Prof. Nityanand in his inaugural address highlighted the relevance of Indian System of Medicines and the growing demand of herbal drugs in the context of changing life style due to socio-cultural and economic forces. He advocated for strengthening the Indian System of Medicine and called for National policy to be formulated and introduced in order to integrate the Indian System of Medicine with modern systems.

Mr. Jitendra Varma, proposed the vote of thanks to Chief Guest and other guests delegates.

The valedictory session was chaired by Dr. Rambhuj, Director, Centre for Environment Education (North Region), Lucknow. Dr. Ram Bhuj highlighted the role of civil society, UNDP, Global Environmental Facility in promoting of environment, biodiversity and cultivation of medicinal plants. He was of the view that India has vast potential for herbal production, traditional system of medicine and a network of civil society organizations. However, in absence of national policy on traditional systems of medicine, we are unable to exploit the

emerging potential while private sector, especially MNC's is exploiting this potential and opportunity. We should think in the new perspective to integrate Indian System of Medicines with modern systems of medicines using the vast infrastructure of public health delivery system.

#### Recommendations

- The quality of primary, secondary and tertiary medical and delivery care system should be improved.
- Networking, integration and mainstreaming of ISM&H institutions and practitioners with modern systems of medicine is required so that people have access to a complimentary system of care.
- In order to provide adequate training and giving confidence to students to practice their system and participate in national programmes, strengthening of ISM & H educational institutions is the need of hour.
- More investment in continuing medical education, infrastructure and quality control, research and development, and manufacturing of drugs should be ensured.
- Conservation, preservation, promotion, cultivation, collection and processing of medicinal and aromatic plants and herbs is required to meed growing demand of ISM & H drugs.
- Ensuring quality control of drugs and their sustainable availability at an affordable cost should be ensured.
- A complete pharmacopoeia of all the systems of ISM & H and drawing up a list of essential drugs and ensuring their availability is imperatively needed.
- Adequate investment in research and development for developing new drugs and formulations, clinical trials, and also patenting them is urgently called for.
- In order to mainstream the ISM & H system and utilize the services of their practitioners, clinics should be located in the primary, secondary and tertiary care institutions of modern medicine.
- More focus on the use of ISM & H therapeutic modalities for treatment of chronic life style related diseases should be given to reduce side effects of modern system of medicine ensure and preventive methods.
- Appropriate communication strategies should be evolved to promote ISM & H among the messes specially the poor and disadvantaged to improve

information, education, communication, and counseling to increase utilization of services under national disease control and family welfare programmes.

- Adequate monitoring mechanism should be evolved to supervise the patients and their responses to the efforts of providing complementary system of health care services of ISM and H.
- An entrance examination for ISM & H undergraduate courses with appropriate eligibility criteria should be introduced to ensure potentially good and only interested students get admission in courses of their choice.
- The course syllabi and curriculum should be revised and updated keeping in mind the potential of employment in the industry growing and wake of LPG and ISM & H services.

The Seminar was attended by 110 delegates comprising of scientists, academicians, administrators, research scholars, practitioners etc. from various institutions. The delegates from 5 states viz. U.P., Uttaranchal, Madhya Pradesh, Karnataka, and Delhi participated in the seminar. Overall 45 papers were presented during various technical sessions.

### CARE AND PROTECTION OF DISADVANTAGED CHILDREN IN URBAN INDIA

#### Introduction

A two-day National Seminar on Care & Protection of Disadvantaged Children in Urban India was organized by Regional Centre on 17th & 18th November, 2006. The Seminar was sponsored by Planning Commission, Government of India, New Delhi.

#### The principal objectives of the Seminar were:

- To review programmes, policies, projects and schemes oriented towards care, protection and empowerment of disadvantaged children in India
- > To examine the status of disadvantaged children in urban India
- > To review the enforcement of Children's Rights Acts and other legal provisions in India
- To examine the impact of Juvenile Justice Act and other legal provisions related to disadvantaged children
- To examine the implementation of various programmes, schemes and projects for care and protection of disadvantaged children in urban India
- To examine the compliance of the recommendations of UN Committee on Child's Rights in India and particularly to assess the progress in India in the context of Millennium Development Goals
- To suggest policy measures for proper implementation, delivery of services and administration of Children's Rights Acts, legal provisions, programmes and schemes in India

#### **Proceedings** in Brief

The Seminar was inaugurated by Sri R.Ramani, IAS, Director General, (Training). Government of Uttar Pradesh. In his inaugural address Sri Ramani said that 'love and affection' to children in the most important issue. He

categorically stated that exploitation of children is an act of vengeance, and must be avoided in totality.

Delivering the Key Note Address, Mrs. Jayati Chandra, I.A.S., Principal Secretary, Department of Horticulture & Food Porcessing, Government of U.P. and Former Joint Secretary, Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Government of India, New Delhi, explained the power of childhood. She is of the opinion that there is not much difference between an 'advantaged' and 'disadvantaged' child and both can be inter-changed according to the situation. The Children's Act gives certain rights - economic and social to children. There is a legal obligation on adults to provide care and protection to disadvantaged children, especially those afflicted by diseases and disability. The child also has the right to be protected by a loving couple. Besides, economic conditions generally determine the disadvantage, e.g. the increasing crime of female foeticide. It is the duty of every urban citizen to help in the prevention of abetment of crime towards the child, in the form of pressure groups, NGOs and individuals. Being a natural guardian of the child it has also been provided in the Indian Penal Code that female foeticide is a crime liable to be punished under law.

In his presidential remarks Prof. R.P. Singh, Vice Chancellor, Lucknow University, Lucknow, pointed out the pathetic way in which deprived children are forced to work and earn their livelihood and support their families. There are so many problems that they have to face due to lack of education and proper facilities. The Government has launched many programmes from time to time for the upliftment of such children, but they have failed to produce the desired

effects. The country lacks in providing this vulnerable group the necessary facilities for their upliftment and the educational and health standards are lacking. He mentioned the efforts of the Lucknow University in educating the poor children living in slums, child labour and street children. He requested the government machinery and the various sections of society to help in contributing towards removing the vices which are being faced by this vulnerable section of our society.

Earlier, Prof. Nishith Rai, Director, RCUES, Lucknow, welcomed the Chief Guest and other distinguished participants. In his welcome address he spelt out the significant role of the Centre in training quality managers in the field of urban government. He said that almost 20% of the world's children population is present in India, and they naturally play a very important role in nation building and the need of the hour is to focus on the integrated development of children as a whole.

Dr. U.B. Singh outlined the Seminar objectives as well as the other details of the Seminar. Dr. Padma Iyer, presented vote of thanks to the chief guest and learned participants

In order to have thred-bare deliberations and discussions on specific issues, a theme paper was developed in joint efforts of Prof. Nishith Rai and Dr. A.K. Singh.

The chief guest of the valedictory session was **Sri Anil Kumar Sagar**, **Director of Urban Local Bodies**, **Government of U.P.** Speaking about the disadvantaged children Sri Sagar described the plight of children in the ICDS programmes and juvenile homes. He also mentioned that education in the urban areas is extremely important. There should be a separate body to administer and monitor it so that poor children can get educated and become good citizens of the country. Commenting on the seminar he said that he was glad that all the stakeholders were involved in the seminar.

Earlier Prof. Nishith Rai. Director of the Centre welcomed the chief guest. **Recommendations** 

- In order to ensure effective implementation of Juvenile Justice Act, a separate Juvenile Judicial System comprising need based procedures, juvenile judicial services, juvenile police and juvenile lawyers etc. should be created.
- The minimum age for a child for all programmes and child development should be 18 years uniformly.

- In order to create a comprehensive data base and child care and protection, as well as child development, the mechanism for data collection by National Sample Survey Organisation and the Census operation mechanism and other agencies should collect more data and information for different age groups of children obtained.
- A separate nodal agency for child development, care & protection be established at the national level with its regional branches so that major research studies, reports, surveys, and other documents may be available at one point to the researchers, policy makers and other development activists.
- In order to promote public- private partnership in child care & protection, involvement of public, private, civil societies and other stakeholders be made statutory. The role and scope for partnerships with civil societies private and corporate sector in children's development needs to be recognized and creative ways of public private partnership in realization of Child Rights should be ensured.
- The proposed draft policy of Integrated Child Protection Scheme should incorporate the role of family, technology loaded solutions, and involvement of corporate sector.
- A professional approach to the child related problems should be followed. Hence, it is imperative to provide for capacity building of all those who deal directly with children or are accountable for ensuring the right to protection of all children including police, teachers, representatives of local bodies and panchayats, bureaucrats, judicial magistrates etc.
- Child protection has to be facilitated through child participation with reference to expression of views, communication of information, freedom and decision making. Involvement and participation of children in committees, commissions and boards etc. may be made statutory.

Around 45 delegates attended the Seminar. In all 30 presentations were made during the technical sessions. **Annexures: LP: II and LF: II** indicate the list of the participants and resource persons respectively to the Seminar.

# Role of Urban Local Government in Disaster Management

## National Seminar Role of Urban Local Government in Disaster Management

A two-day National Seminar on Role of Urban Local Government in Disaster Management was organized by the Regional Centre on 23rd and 24th March, 2007. The Seminar was held under the joint auspices of the Ministry of Urban Development, Government of India, New Delhi and Department of Urban Development, Government of Uttar Pradesh, Lucknow.

The principal objectives of the Seminar were:

- i) to review the status, situation, dimensions and trends of disasters and their impact on development;
- ii) to examine role of government agencies in disaster mitigation and response;
- iii) to examine the role of NGO'S, community based organizations, and other stakeholders in disaster management;
- iv) to review the status of disaster management strategies;
- v) to discuss the scope and prospects of disaster mitigation planning;
- vi) to discuss institutional arrangements for urban risk mitigation;
- vii) to share experiences in managing disasters;
- viii) to suggest policy measures for disaster mitigation and response.

#### Proceedings in Brief

The seminar was inaugurated **Prof. R.P. Singh**, **Vice-Chancellor**, **Lucknow University**, **Lucknow**. In his inaugural address he talked about various types of disasters in Indian perspective and highlighted the role of urban local bodies, NGO's and educational institutions in disaster management. **Sri R.K. Chaturvedi**, **Director (UD)**, **Ministry of Urban Development**, **Government of India** in his presidential remarks said that disaster management needs multi-dimensional approaches and involvement of various stakeholders. He talked about the efforts of central and state governments in the field of disaster management. He also raised the issue of building bye-laws that should be implemented effectively by the state governments.



Earlier, **Prof. Nishith Rai, Director, RCUES, Lucknow** welcomed the Chief Guest and other distinguished participants. In his welcome address he spelt out the significant role of urban local government in disaster mitigation and management. He felt the need of strengthening urban local bodies in disaster mitigation and management through capacity building.

Sri S.P. Singh. Special Secretary, Department of Urban Development, Government of Uttar Pradesh, Lucknow discussed the emerging trends and patterns of urbanization and its implications on urban development. He said that there is wider scope for urban local bodies in disaster mitigation and management in the context of decentralized governance.

Dr. U.B. Singh, Joint Director, Regional Centre outlined objectives as well as details of the seminar. Dr. A.K. Singh, Assistant Director of the Centre, presented vote of thanks

Dr. A.K. Singh presented the theme paper at the Plenary Session. The presentation covered various aspects of disaster mitigation, and management..

The valedictory session was chaired by **Sri Anil Kumar Sagar**, **Director, Directorate of Urban Local Bodies, Government of U.P.,** Lucknow. **Sri B.P. Singh, IG (Fire Services)** was Guest of Honour. Sri B.P. Singh called for strengthening decentralized governance for managing disasters. He also said that digital mapping for urban areas is imperative for assessing lesson risks and their mitigation. Sri Anil Sagar said that role of local bodies in disaster management is limited, however, the decentralized governance has open vast opportunities for them. Coordinated efforts are needed during

disasters while guidelines and buildings bye-laws are to be effectively implemented in urban areas.

Earlier **Prof. Nishith Rai** welcomed the guests. In his address he emphasized on strengthening the role of local bodies in managing urban disasters.

#### **Recommendations:**

- There should be a comprehensive 'Training Manuals' encompassing of situation analysis of disasters, preventive and risk reduction measures, resources and other vital information in order to provide capacity building to the manpower and representatives of local bodies/civil societies and other stakeholder agencies.
- Applications of GIS and remote sensing should be encouraged in order to effectively analyze and interpret the available data for risk reduction.
- Best practices pertaining to disaster mitigation and management should be documented properly and be disseminated in vernacular language and pictorial format to the community.
- Specific courseware should be designed and be implemented by all educational institutions to inculcate education and knowledge among the school going children, NGOs, and other government agencies.
- In order to create awareness and sensitization regarding risk, hazard, disaster mitigation and management among the community, the activities of different implementing agencies should be strictly monitored and responsibility should be entrusted to the concern agency.
- Coordination, knowledge net-working among the various stakeholders, researchers, academicians, and NGOs is imperative and should be updated on regular basis by a nodal agency.
- Effective implementation of building bye-laws be ensured by the state government and the role of local bodies in construction of buildings and infrastructure should be strengthened in order to promote earthquake resistant design and construction of buildings as well as to reduce risk.
- Fraining of artisans, masons and engineers about earthquake resistant measures should be imparted in order to propagate the principles of earthquake

resistant design of buildings, which will immensely reduce the vulnerability of buildings and also the new construction which will come-up will be done by taking all the earthquake resistant measures into account.

- There should be provision of minimum 1000 temporary intermediate shelters as a infrastructure facility at District HQ, which can be put to the affected areas within 24 hours for the affected people, and after permanent settlement of affected people the same can be brought to District HQ.
- Involvement of private sector in disaster mitigation and management is imperative. Similarly, creating conditions for the development of insurance markets, and encouraging the use of other risk reduction financial instruments are need of hour.
- Microfinancing for poor is imperative in order to reduce the vulnerability to natural hazards and recovery from disasters.
- There should be politico-administrative will for adopting sustainable development practices which ensure people centred and decentralized development paradigms.
- The rehabilitation should be acceptable to the community i.e. to be formulated considering the local needs of the people, their cultural and social traditions.

Around 90 delegates representing various institutions, departments, ministry, agencies etc. from across the states in India participated in the seminar. In all 35 presentations were made during the technical sessions. **Annexures: LP-III and LF: III** present the list of delegates and resource persons respectively.

#### TWO ORIENTATION WORKSHOPS ON UIDSSMT & IHSDP

The Government of India has launched an ambitious programme known as Jawaharlal Nehru National Urban Renewal Mission (JNNURM) on December 3, 2005 for the planned, integrated and sustainable development of urban infrastructure in cities/towns. The duration of the Mission is seven years starting from 2005-06 to 2011-12. Initially 63 cities have been identified under the Mission. This Mission has two sub-missions:

Sub-Mission I on Urban Infrastructure & Governance Sub-Mission II on Basic Services for Poor

For rest of the cities/towns in the country, other two schemes known as Urban Infrastructure Development for Small & Medium Towns (UIDSSMT) and Integrated Housing & Slum Development Programme (IHSDP) have been initiated by the Government of India.

With this perspective, the Centre organized two one day Orientation Workshops at Jabalpur on June 16 & 17, 2006 respectively.

The workshop had the following objectives:

- To sensitize the participants with the new schemes in urban sector launched by Government of India
- To familiarize the participants with the pre-requisites for accessing the monetary assistance under the new schemes and
- To highlight the role and responsibilities of elected representatives/officials in the implementation of UIDSSMT and IHSDP.

The workshop focused on salient features of UIDSSMT & IHSDP, strategy of Madhya Pradesh Government and role and responsibilities of elected representatives in the implementation of schemes.

## Participation

The workshop was attended by 55 elected members of President-in-Councils of nagar palikas of Jabalpur Division. **Annexure: LP –IV** presents the list of participants.

- There is no technical staff in the smaller ULBs. Hence a technical cell if possible in each ULB or otherwise at least at the district level should be established for providing guidance to smaller palikas.

Both the workshops were directed by Dr. Urmila Bagga, Joint Director.

# **Workshop on Good Urban Practices**

Rapid urbanization has led to over-stressing of urban infrastructure services including Municipal Solid Waste Management. The issue of solid waste management has been given significant importance in both the newly launched schemes of JNNURM and UIDSSMT. The Twelfth Finance commission has also given priority to solid waste managements.

Report Card System is a strategic tool developed to help citizens provide feed back and engage state agencies in efforts to improve service delivery and governance. The repot card system has been introduced in several cities and towns and it has helped in providing stimulus to several public service agencies to review and improve their performance and attitude towards its customers.

Double entry accounting system is an effective and better tool of accounting. Under JNNURM, it has been made mandatory for all the ULBs to convert from Single Entry to Double Entry System of Accounting for efficient management of accounts.

Keeping in view the importance of the above issues the Regional Centre organized a Workshop on Good Urban Practices on August 3, 2006 at Bhopal.

## **Objectives**

- To acquaint the participants with the Report Card Process
- > To acquaint the participants with the importance, need and system of Survey under RC process
- > To acquaint the participants with the importance of Double Entry Accounting System
- > To make the participants feel the need and importance of Solid Waste Management

The workshop focused on Report Card System: Its need, importance and methodology, Municipal Solid Waste Management, and importance and Double Entry Accounting System in Urban Administration.

## Participation

Commissioners Nagar Nigams, Divisional Deputy Directors of Urban Administration, Departmental Executives/ Engineers, Chief Municipal Officers, of Distt. Headquarter towns and all Class-1 towns were nominated and 92 participants participated in the workshop. List is enclosed as **Annexure: LP - VI**


#### **Resource Persons**

## Feedback and Suggestions

The main outcome of the workshop was that the participants and municipal officials of the Madhya Pradesh Govt. felt more informed and sensitized towards the urgent need of implementing Report Card System and Double Entry Accounting System in the State. They were able to get more information about the latest technologies and best practices in SWM.

Shri P.D. Meena, Principal Secretary, Urban Administration & Development Deptt., appreciating the work being done by RCUES in U.P., advocated that RCUES should take up the work of implementing the Report Card System and Solid Waste Management in the State on priority basis. - Once the projects are prepared by the consultants, these should be discussed in detail at various levels so as to enable all stakeholders to have awareness and provide suggestions to make it more oriented towards the felt needs and requirements of the community.
- Study tours should also be arranged where the projects are being implemented.

- Members of dedicated project team should not be transferred during the duration of project if the desired results from such important and ambitious schemes have to be obtained within the prescribed time frame.

# Mobilizing Financial Resources for Municipal Governance

The future of India is inescapably urban. India's urban issues with all their related challenges and opportunities merit serious concern. In order to improve the financial position of ULBs and prompt them to mobilize more internal resources, all the State Finance Commissions' have linked devolutions to the financial performance of ULBs. However, the financial position of majority of ULBs remains precarious. Necessary steps are called for to improve the financial situation of ULBs. For financing urban projects these agencies need to have access to capital market.

Hence a five days' training programme on "Mobilizing Financial Resources for Municipal Governance" was organized by the Regional Centre for the municipal officials of Uttar Pradesh from April 24-28, 2006.


The main objectives of the training were as follows:-

- To emphasize on various methods for optimum utilization of existing financial resources
- To familiarize the participants with the innovative financing tools like access to capital markets, tax free municipal bonds, pooled financing, borrowing from commercial banks etc.
- To highlight the pre conditions for innovative infrastructure financing including the pricing of urban services, and
- To highlight the need for committed political and administrative leadership

The programme focused on Review of Current Financial Resources; Valuation & Assessment of Municipal Revenue; Reforms in Property Tax Administration; Role of CFC & SFC; Role & Responsibilities of DDO's; Public-Private Partnership; Community participation; Access to Institutional Finance etc.

## Participation

The programme was attended by twenty Executive Officers belonging to various local bodies-both Nagar Palika Parishads and Nagar Panchayats of Uttar Pradesh. They all were Executive Officers. The list of participants is annexed at **Annexure LP: X** 



#### **Resource Persons**

The eminent guest faculty included senior officials of State Government as well as the internal faculty of the RCUES. The list of guest is enclosed at **Annexure:** LF-X

The Chief guest at the valedictory session was Sri S.P.Singh, Special Secretary, Deptt. of Urban Development, Government of Uttar Pradesh, who distributed the certificates to the participants, besides addressing on the need and importance of municipal resource mobilization.

## Feed Back and Group Report

All the participants were very enthusiastic about having learnt the details of newly launched schemes like JNNURM, UIDSSMT and IHSDP. They made following suggestions for raising financial resources in their group report on Municipal Reforms.

## 1. ORGANIZATIONAL RESTRUCTURING

- Nagar Palika Parishads and Nagar Panchayat are supposed to perform 36 mandatory/compulsory duties and around 22 discretionary functions as provided in U.P. Municipalities Act 1916. These duties/functions may be allocated to various departments/sections according to nature of work. For this suitable posts may be created after assessment/evaluation of these duties and accordingly, the appointments to these post may be made specially in Nagar Panchayats.
- Proper trade training should be given to new entrants as well as those all ready working.
- Transfer of Non-Centralized staff.

## 2. REVENUE GENERATION

- ► Imposition of taxes may be made mandatory under Section 128.
- The lamp fitted over poles of Electricity Department should be made free on public interest or the Municipalities should charge tax/rent on such poles on which consumer connection is given in addition to transformers etc.
- Mobile companies cable operators should pay for laying of cables etc. It would be better if state decides about this issue to have uniformity.
- Incentive fund allocation should also consider the non-revenue activities i.e. community development issue etc.
- Share of Nagar Panchayats should be more in SFC as infrastructure development is less in these units.

#### STRENGTHENING THE OFFICE OF EXECUTIVE OFFICER

- 1. Executive Officer should be made pure Government servant and his services should be lent to the Local Bodies, eg. BDOs
- 2. The post of Executive Officer should be made Gazatted because he is required to issue various certificates, summons, orders etc.

3. Executive Officer is required to perform certain other functions which involve law and order i.e. removal of encroachment from public land/roads/ponds etc. Issue of distress warrant, issue of orders for search and seizure of certain articles/goods unhealthy for consumption (even drugs) etc.

The Programme was directed by Dr. Anjuli Misra, Dy. Director.

# Urban Planning and Project Management

The 74th CAA regards urban planning including town planning as the legitimate function of urban local bodies and provides for the mandatory constitution of District Planning Committee (DPC) and Metropolitan Planning Committees (MPC). The conforming legislations of majority of the states however have just included a provision for DPC & MPC in their respective Acts but have not dealt with mechanism for their settings up and their relationship with the existing agencies dealing with planning. The urban reform agenda initiated through JNNURM now makes it binding on the urban local bodies and parastatal agencies to take necessary measures in this direction.

Project management is one of the significant sectors that has been receiving attention of all concerned in every sector of development. The formulation of well structured projects and their timely and efficient implementation is most significant for mobilizing and brining qualitative improvement in the development process. The importance of well structured projects enhances more especially when the available resources especially the finances are limited. Financial planning and analysis of project is equally important in the planned development. In this backdrop, the Centre organized a five days training programme on **Project Planning and Management from May 16-20, 2006.** 

## **Objectives:**

- To examine the issue of social planning versus physical planning in urban planning systems.
- To focus on the various institutions and programmes for guided development
- To familiarize the participants with the concept and stages of project management.
- > To underline the importance of integrated approach to urban planning & project management.

The programme focused on Importance of Integrated Urban Planning and Development in the context of 74th CAA, Resource Development & Urban Planning, all stages in the project life cycle right from conception of project to their monitoring and evaluation, Role and Relevance of Environmental Impact Assessment of Projects, salient features of JNNURM, UIDSSMT & IHSDP etc.

## **Participation**

The programme was attended by 26 officials representing Town and Country Planning Department, Development Authorities, Nagar Nigams and Nagar Palika Parishads. **Annexure:** LP-XI presents the list of participants.

#### **Resource Persons**

The internal faculty was supported by the experts drawn from the relevant fields. Annexure: LF-XI presents the list of resource persons for the programme.

## Feedback and Suggestions

According to majority of the participants, the programme was well planned, balanced, useful and appreciable and expressed their satisfaction with the overall conduct and achievement of the objectives of the programme.

The suggestions put forth by the participants are mentioned below:

- The duration of the programme should not be less than ten days for such a comprehensive subject.
- The clientele to the programme should also include the higher level officials at the decision making level so that number of issues could be discussed in their presence.
- Middle level officials of Town & Country Planning Department should also be involved in the preparation of CDP under JNNURM.
- More pragmatic considerations should be given to the practical field problems faced by the officials dealing with the implementation of urban development projects.
- Professional attitude needs to be developed and adopted while managing the urban development projects.
- A clear cut delineation of roles and responsibilities of various organizations and personnel including elected representatives woking in the urban sector needs to be made in order to ensure accountability and transparency.
- Public representatives should also be held responsible and accountable on account of their non-performance.

Figure Grievance redressal mechanism needs to be made more effective for the quick disposal of cases.

# Municipal Financial Management

Financial Management is an important policy intervention area. Although, traditionally the objectives of Municipal finance has been to generate more financial resources but inadequate attention has been given for their efficient management. This situation now calls for application of various techniques and tools to make financial management effective including the need for revision of manuals and forms.

With a view to streamline the management of municipal financess, the Regional Centre organized a five days training programme on Municipal Financial Management from May 22-26, 2006 with the following main objectives:


- To examine the prevalent inter-governmental financial relations and to identify the areas for reform
- To highlight the desired arrangements to ensure financial accountability
- To examine the needed reforms in municipal accounting and auditing systems

The programme concentrated on Intergovernmental Financial relations; Municipal Finance: present status and need for reform; Municipal Budgeting; Municipal Financial responsibility; Reforms in Municipal Accounting & Auditing Systems and Community participation etc. There was a study visit to UPDESCO, Lucknow, where participants were made aware of the different uses of computers and the importance of Information Technology in the working of Local Bodies. A Panel Discussion on "Policies and Procedure for Efficient Tapping of Existing Sources" presided over by Prof.K.Sreeram, Consultant, RCUES was also held.

## **Participation**

The programme was attended by twenty senior municipal officials who included Executive officers and Accountants of Nagar Nigams and Nagar

Palika Parishads of the state of Uttar Pradesh. The list of participants is annexed as **Annexure:** LP – XII.



#### **Resource Persons**

The Guest Faculty included senior officials from the State Government and financial experts and consultants. However, the faculty of the RCUES also presented their views and delivered lectures on the relevant topics. The list of speakers is enclosed at **Annexure: LF-XII** 

### Feed Back and Suggestions

The participants were generally satisfied with the course which had fulfilled its objectives to a great extent according to them. They presented a group report on "Policies and Procedures for Efficient Tapping of Existing Sources". Major suggestions are as under:

- All functions enlisted in the XIIth Schedule should be transferred to ULBs along with funds and functionaries.
- Self-Assessment System for property tax as applicable in nagar nigams should also be introduced in nagar palika parishads and nagar panchayats also.

- Imposition of taxes should be made mandatory in nagar palika parishads and nagar panchayats also as is prevalent in case of nagar nigams.
- Accountants should be trained in computer operations.
- Non-centralised employees should be transferred within the division so as to enhance the efficiency of local body.
- The posts of Accounts Officer and Asst. Accounts Officer should be created in Class I ULBs keeping in view the enhanced responsibilities of Executive Officers due to the launch of various ambitious schemes of Government of India such as UIDSSMT, IHSDP etc. Currently only Nagar Nigams have the posts of Accounts Officers and Asstt. Accounts Officers.

The course was directed by Dr.Anjuli Mishra, Dy.Director.

## URBAN PLANNING AND PROJECT MANAGEMENT

Land is inelastic but its use changes with the passage of time and with increasing pressure of population. Change in land use in urban areas is frequent and is a critical factor in determining the environmental quality. The Proper urban planning and project management can contribute greatly in reducing both disaster risk and the vulnerability of the human settlements, improve urban economy and efficiency of the city, and help in maintaining ecological stability.

In the light of 74<sup>th</sup> Constitutional Amendment, this function assumes importance for City Managers. Poorly planned cities and inadequate infrastructure clearly impose unnecessary costs on the local governments. With this view a five days' training programme on "Urban Planning and Project Management" was organized by the Regional Centre for the municipal officials of Uttar Pradesh from June 26 to 30, 2006.

## **Objectives**

The main objectives of the training were as follows:

- To examine the issue of "social planning" versus "physical planning" in urban planning systems
- To focus on the various institutions and instruments available for guided development
- To familiarize the participants with the various aspects of urban planning and stages of project management, and

To underline the importance of integrated approach to urban planning and project development.

The focus areas of the training programme included, Urban Challenges, Concepts of Urban Planning and Project Management, Planning Norms and Standards for key Urban services like water supply, solid wastes management, roads, parks and recreational activities etc., Urban project Management Cycle, JNNURM and related projects and Emerging Urban Management issues like Citizen's Character, Right to Information, Transparency etc.

## **Participation**

The programme was attended by twenty five senior officers, who included Executive Officers and Civil Engineers of Nagar Nigams, Nagar Palika Parishads and Nagar Panchayats of Uttar Pradesh. The list of participants is annexed at **Annexure: LP-XIII.**

They were of the unanimous opinion that such courses should be designed for the elected members of the municipalities as well as for the other officers of the urban local bodies in order that its purpose may be more effective.

## PUBLIC PRIVATE PARTNERSHIP IN MUNICIPAL GOVERNANCE

Given the poor state of finances of urban governments in India, they are unable to maintain services at the present level. Public Private Partnership in municipal services offers the hope to meet the growing demands of urban infrastructure services. To ensure this, there is a growing need to redefine the role of government agencies vis-a-vis private parties. The governments have to play the role of facilitator rather than the role of principal actor. The services can only be delivered more efficiently and effectively by the involvement of private sector keeping in view the fact that the private sector has the advantage of having better record of efficiency in resource utilization.

Keeping the importance of Public Private Partnership in urban services delivery system, the Regional Centre organized a five days training programme on PUBLIC PRIVATE PARTNERSHIP IN MUNICIPAL GOVERNANCE from July 24-28, 2006 for municipal officials of Uttar Pradesh.

## **Objectives**

The objectives of the course were as follows:

- To underline the need for importance of private sector participation in urban management
- To acquaint the participants with various modes of private sector participation

- To make them aware of the need to develop effective regulatory mechanism to safe guard the interests of the citizens; and
- To acquaint participants with best municipal-private sector participation in various sectors.

The programme focussed on Need for Private Sector Participation in Urban Management, Modes/Options of Municipal Private Sector Participation, Development of regulatory frame work and enabling environment for private sector participation and Successful case studies in municipal governance. Participants were also taken for a study tour to Kanpur Nagar Nigam where hospital waste management is being done through public private partnership.

## Participation

The programme was attended by twenty-five senior level officers of urban local bodies, Uttar Pradesh, who included executive officers and civil engineers of Nagar Nigams, Nagar Palika Parishads and Nagar Panchayats. The list of participants is enclosed at **Annexure: LP-XIV.**

#### **Feedback**

The participants were of the opinion that the course discussed the maximum topics, covering the maximum facets of Public-Private Participation in providing urban services. The theoretical concept, principles and application of public-private participation as a solution of good governance were discussed to overall satisfaction to the officers. They were of the view that practical uses (through study tour) and methodology of PPP in urban government would prove very beneficial to all of them.

The course was directed by Dr. Anjuli Mishra, Dy. Director who was assisted by Dr. A.K. Singh, Asstt. Director.

# AREA BASED PROPERTY TAX SYSTEM : PRINCIPLES AND PRACTICES

The laws of property tax in India and their implementation generally suffer from a number of problems relating to matters like fixation of the tax base and rates, tax assessment, tax collection, tax exemptions, disputes and their resolution, etc. besides unscientific and discretion-less method of assessing it.

Patna Municipal Corporation was one of the first municipal bodies to reform its property tax system. The model adopted by this Corporation is characterized by 'simplicity and low rates'. Following the success of property tax reforms in Bihar, Andhra Pradesh, etc., the Ministry of Urban Development, Government of India, issued guidelines for reforms of this tax in October, 1998.

As per the recommendations of the First State Finance Commission in U.P. the carpet area based assessment system of property tax was introduced in Nagar Nigams, broadly on the Patna Corporation Model.

Hence a five days' training programme on "AREA BASED PROPERTY TAX SYSTEM: PRINCIPLES AND PRACTICES" was organized by the Regional Centre for the senior municipal officials from August 21-25, 2006.

## **Main Objectives**

The main objectives of the training were as follows:


- To make the participants aware of the principles of the area based property tax system.
- To acquaint them with necessary tools and techniques for the administration of the new system
- To highlight the managerial and personnel issues that need attention while switching over to the new system and
- Measures that need to be taken to ensure that the new system is citizen-friendly and transparent.

The focus areas of the training included Importance of Property Tax Administration in present urban context, Salient Features of Area-Based Property Tax System, Implementing the Self-Assessment System, Changes required for administering the area-based property tax system including computerization of the tax management and necessary measures to make the system citizen-friendly.

Two Study Tours were organized to Kanpur and Lucknow Nagar Nigams, where participants were made aware of the applications of GIS scheme in Property Tax Management System. There was also a Panel Discussion on "Problems and Suggestions in Strengthening Property Tax System" which was presided over by Sri Diwakar Tripathi, Director, State Urban Development Agency, Government of Uttar Pradesh and led by Prof. Nishith Rai, Director of RCUES. Sri Diwakar Tripathi, Director, SUDA was the Chief Guest at the valedictory session.

## **Participation**

The programme was attended by seventeen senior municipal officials who included Executive Officers, Revenue Officers and Junior Engineers from Nagar Palika Parishads and Nagar Panchayats the state of Uttar Pradesh and Madhya Pradesh. The list of participants is annexed at **Annexure: LP-XV.**

# GOOD URBAN GOVERNANCE: PRINCIPLES AND PRACTICES

The growing urban population, haphazard and unplanned urban development, degrading urban environment and increasing level of poverty can be managed only by good urban governance. Good governance means openness, listening, motivating, integrating or convincing people to participate according to their own goals; goals which are part of a wider democratic will, self formulating and self regulating.

Good governance is a cooperative effort for sustainable development, undertaken by local government, civil society groups and the private business sector. With this end in view, the RCUES organized a five days' training programme on GOOD URBAN GOVERNANCE: PRINCIPLES AND PRACTICES from August 28 to September 1, 2006.

## **Objectives**

The main objectives of the training programme were as follows:


To make the participants aware of good governance attributes

- > To highlight the need for SMART governance in the changing urban context
- > To highlight the best urban governance practices in the country and else where, and
- To examine the feasibility of their replication and the consequential change that needs to be undertaken-legislative, administrative etc.

The main contents covered during the programme included Good Governance: Concept & Attributes, Municipal structures and organizations, Financial Management, Urban Services & e-governance, Private Sector and Community Participation in urban management, Successful Case-Studies, Inter-agency Coordination and Report Card System.

Srivastava, Secretary, Urban Development, Jharkhand said that the adhoc arrangements for urban administration in Bihar and Jharkhand have caused concern and there is imperative need for restructuring of Urban Local Self Government. Sri Amal Kumar Verma, Principal Secretary, Urban Development, Government of U.P. said that no doubt the daunting challenges of urban development have caused concern but capacity development and use of appropriate technology may enable municipal administrators to cope with the emerging challenges of urban development in the State.

Sri Anil Kumar Sagar, Director, Directorate of Urban Local Bodies, Government of U.P. while addressing the participants mentioned that the need for public-private partnership, GIS mapping and scientific disposal of solid waste are imperative in the present context.

Prof. N.K. Rai, Director, RCUES, Lucknow welcomed the guests participants and officials. He expressed his view that training would increase the managerial efficiency of special officers.

Dr. Anjuli Mishra, Dy. Director, RCUES coordinated the training programme.

# **Management of Urban Environment**

Environmental awareness is essential to harmonize patterns of individual/institutional behaviour in harmony with environmental conservation. Awareness involves increased understanding of adverse impacts of various actions on public health, living conditions and livelihood prospects. Access to environmental information is the main means by which stakeholders evaluate

compliance of their actions with environmental standards, legal requirements etc. It is with this background that Regional Centre organized a five days training on Management of Urban Environment from September 12 to 16, 2006.

## **Key Objectives**

Following were the major objectives of the programme.

- To make the different organizations dealing with the urban developmental activities realize the need for environmental protection
- To acquaint the participants with various laws relating to urban environment and the agencies responsible for their enforcement
- > To highlight the adverse environmental impact, in general and on air, water and noise in particular, in the context of changing urban scenario, and
- > To underline the need for active civil society participation in environmental management.

#### Focus Areas


Besides highlighting the key issues and challenges of urban environment, the contents of the programme focused on sustainable urban development in the environmental context, solid waste management, sanitation in urban India, hospital waste management, rain water harvesting and role of NGOs and community in protection and conservation of environment etc. Participants were also made familiar with the need and importance of Environmental Impact Assessment guidelines issued by GOI as well as the salient features of JNNURM. Two field visits – one to E-SUVIDHA CENTRE at Lucknow and another to a government hospital to witness the arrangements made for handling the hospital waste were also organized for the benefit and awareness of participating officials.

### **Participation**

Twenty – four officials including one Health office from Bilaspur Municipal Corporation, Chhattisgarh attended the course **Annexure: LP-XVII** indicates the list of participants.

#### Inauguration

Sri S.P. Singh, Special Secretary, Department of Urban Development, Government of U.P. inaugurated the programme. While talking about the global environmental challenges, he emphasized upon devising appropriate mechanism for balancing the environmental concerns with the economic development in order to achieve the environmental sustainability.



#### Valediction

Valedictory session was presided over by Sri Abhiraj Singh, Director, Ministry of Environment and Forests. During his valedictory address, he pointed out towards climatic changes, the loss of bio-diversity and other issues relating to environmental damage and stressed on the need for coherent efforts on the part of all stakeholders to successfully counter the environmental challenges.

## Feedback and Suggestions

Majority of the participants expressed their satisfaction with the overall conduct of the programme. Following were the major suggestions made by participants.

- More stress should be given on the simplification of procedures adopted for the implementation of environmental programmes in the context of present democratic set up in urban local bodies.
- Elected representatives should also be invited for the training programmes along with the officials of ULBs and related agencies so that they could also get sensitized about the gravity of environmental problems and the remedial measures required to minimize the same.
- General masses should also be made aware about the deteriorating environment and their role and responsibilities in conserving and preserving the environment through wide publicity and awareness campaigns.
- Field visits to the smaller ULBs in U.P. as well as other states which have adopted some good/innovative approaches in different sectors should also be arranged so that participating officials could have face to face discussions with the concerned officials involved in planning and implementation of good practices in urban services sector. Such field visits should not be of less than one week's duration.

The course was directed by Dr. Urmila Bagga, Jt. Director in the Centre.

## MANAGEMENT OF LOW COST HOUSING SCHEMES

Housing or shelter is a basic human need. However, it is beyond the means of low-income households, who constitute the majority of the population in developing countries although these low-income households contribute greatly to the economic development of the country. Hence their housing needs should be accepted as state responsibility.

Presently, various Governments in development countries are allocating substantial resources for housing for the low-income people. However, looking into the size of the problem, and the available resources, it is necessary to effect cost reduction through better design, selection of cheap material, saving in labour and through appropriate technology.

Hence, a five days' training programme on Management of Low Cost Housing Schemes was organized by the Centre for the municipal engineers of Uttar Pradesh and Madhya Pradesh from September 19 to 23, 2006.

## **Objectives**

The main objectives of the training programme were as follows:

- To highlight the importance of low cost housing in the present urban scenario
- To identify available low cost housing policy options
- To emphasize upon the advance planning, adoption of appropriate management techniques, low cost design and construction material etc. and
- To underline the importance of participatory approach to low cost housing projects etc.

#### **Focus Areas**

The key issues covered during the programme included Housing Policy, Need and importance of low cost housing projects, Low cost designs, building material and construction techniques; Financing of low cost housing projects, Public-Private Partnerships and community participation etc. There was also a Field Visit to Building Centre of HUDCO, Government of U.P., Lucknow where participants learnt the low cost techniques of buildings.

#### **Participation**

The programme was attended by fifteen senior level officers, who included Executive Engineers, Assistant Engineers and Junior Engineers of Nagar Nigams and Nagar Palika Parishads of Uttar Pradesh and Madhya Pradesh. The list of participants is annexed at **Annexure: LP-XVIII.**

# **Management of Solid Wastes**

The Management of Solid Waste has emerged as a major issue and a challenge for urban areas. Solid Waste Management (SWM) is an obligatory function of Urban Local Bodies (ULBs). They are not able to provide satisfactory solid waste service due to financial and institutional constaints. The growth in municipal waste generation in our urban centres has outpaced the

growth in population in recent years. The reasons for this trend could be our changing lifestyles, food habits and changes in the standard of living. In contrast to the amount of waste produced, the collection efficiency in metropolitan cities is 70-90 per cent and 50 per cent in smaller cities.

The Municipal Solid Waste Management Rules, 2000 lays emphasis on certain important aspects of SWM which are also mandatory provisions and the Municipalities are supposed to follow these in the management of solid waste.

Hence a four days training programme on "Management of Solid Wastes" was organized by the Regional Centre for Urban and Environmental Studies (RCUES), Lucknow for the senior Municipal Officials from November 8<sup>th</sup> to 11<sup>th</sup>, 2006.

## **Main Objectives**

The main objectives of the training were as follows:

- > To focus on various management issues involved in operating this service,
- > To highlight various low cost technical options available for its management
- To underline the importance of private sector and community participation in effective provision of this service.
- To stress the need for inter- agency coordination in the management of the service.

The focus areas of the training included Urbanization vis-a-vis Solid Wastes Management, Storage, Collection and Transportation of Solid wastes, Disposal of wastes: Problems and Prospects, Hospital Waste Management, Community, Civil Society and Private sector participation in Solid Wastes Management, Inter agency coordination, Successful case studies, Recycling of Waste. There was also a panel discussion on "Managing Municipal Solid Wastes" which was presided over by Sri Anil Kumar Sagar, Director, Urban Local Bodies, Government of Uttar Pradesh and led by Prof. Nishith Rai, Director of RCUES. He was also the Chief Guest of the Valedictory Session.

## Participation

The programme was attended by nineteen senior officers, who included Dy. Municipal Commissioner and Asst. Municipal Commissioner of Nagar Nigam and Executive officers of Nagar Palika Parishads of U.P. The list of participants is enclosed as **Annexure: LP-XIX.**

The course was directed by Dr. Anjuli Mishra Dy. Director under the overall guidance of Prof. Nishith Rai, Director (RCUES).

# Master Plan and Zoning Regulation

A long term plan for the planned development of a city is called Master Plan. For developing a detailed master plan, the social, political, economic, geographical and cultural aspects of the city are kept in mind. While implementing master plan, developmental possibilities for next 15-20 years is kept in mind hence it forms an important part of decision-making document. The work of Master Plan has been assigned priority in the 74<sup>th</sup> Amendment Act & 18 works assigned under the 12<sup>th</sup> schedule. In the near future the work of Master Planning & Zoning has to be transferred to the local bodies by the State Government. Keeping in mind the importance of above, the RCUES organized a five-day training programme on "Master Plan & Zoning Regulation" from 20-24 November, 2006 for officials of Local Bodies from U.P. & M.P. State.

#### **Focus Areas**

The Contents of the programme included Urban Planning in India, Master Plan: Concept & Issues, Zoning Regulation, CDP, Zoning Regulations, Building Bye-laws, RWH & PPP in Urban Infrastructure Development.

#### **Participation**

Twenty three engineers from Nagar Palika Parishads and Jal Sansthans of U.P. and M.P. participated in the programme. **Annexure : LP-XX** gives the list of participants

#### . Resource Persons

### ORIENTATION TRAINING PROGRAMME FOR NEWLY APPOINTED EXECUTIVE OFFICERS OF U.P.

In the past few years, Executive Officers had been appointed to the urban local bodies of the State of Uttar Pradesh, but they had not received any training on urban government. Therefore, there was a long-felt need to orient them and to give them input on the various aspects of urban administration and management and on the recent government policies in order to build their individual capacities. With this view, a ten-days' training programme was organized for newly appointed Executive Officers from November 27 to December 6, 2006.

#### **Objectives**

The programme had the following objectives:

- To make the officials aware of their duties and responsibilities
- To familiarize them with the various legislations relating to urban management and
- To acquaint them with the working of ULBs including the financial management.

#### **Focus Areas**

The participants to the course were familiarized with the various legislative aspects of the U.P. Municipalities Act, 1916, as amended in 1994, the changing perspectives of urban governance with special emphasis on good governance, along with the functions of the executive in general, their powers and responsibilities in particular, leave rules, pay fixation, T.A., D.A. Rules

etc., urban planning, management of urban services, municipal financial management, municipal personnel management, management of urban wastes, disciplinary proceedings and application of computers (e-governance) and team working. The participants were also acquainted with the Urban Reforms Agenda of the Government of India, with special emphasis on the Jawaharlal Nehru National Urban Renewal Mission (JNNURM) and its sub-programmes.

#### **Focus Areas**



#### **Focus Areas**



They made suggestions to strengthen the municipal finance of urban local bodies, like making municipal taxes mandatory, imposing user charges, and introducing unit area method for assessment of property tax in all the urban local bodies of the State.

The Orientation Training Programme was directed by Dr.Richa Varmani, Joint Director.

#### **Report Card System**

Report Card System is a strategic tool developed to help citizens provide feed back and engage state agencies in order to improve service delivery and governance. Studies have been undertaken by various bodies to establish and monitor public opinion with respect to the delivering public services. The Report Card System attempts to assess, rank and benchmark the following parameters: i) overall satisfaction with service delivery (levels of services), ii) the extent and coverage of services; ifi) patterns of emerging problems; iv) the response of agencies to reported problems and grievances; v) the effectiveness of bribes in rectifying reported problems.

In the state of Uttar Pradesh, Report Card System was introduced on a pilot basis under UNDP assisted project on Capacity Development for Urban Governance. The system has become a regular feature in the state. The RCUES has already conducted Report Card Survey in 51 Class I towns of U.P. In order to implement Report Card System effectively in other Urban Local Bodies, a three day's training programme on Report Card System was organized from February 7-9; 2007 by RCUES, Lucknow.

#### **Objectives**

The training programme had the following main objectives:

- To discuss concept, need, and importance of Report Card System
- > To discuss the planning strategy, process and method of Report Card System being implemented
- > To acquaint the participants with various aspects of Report Card System and its advantages

#### Focus Areas

The focus of training programme was on conceptualization, need and importance of Report Card System; planning strategy, process and method, findings of Report Card System, ranking achieved by different towns and experience sharing.

#### **Participation**

25 Asst.Municipal Commissioners and Executive Officers of various ULBs of U.P. participated in the programme. The list of participants is annexed as **Annexure: LP-XXIV**.

# ORIENTATION WORKSHOP ON URBAN INFRASTRUCTURE DEVELOPMENT SCHEME FOR SMALL AND MEDIUM TOWNS (UIDSSMT)

The government of India in the Ministry of Urban Development has launched a new scheme entitled Urban Infrastructure Development Scheme for Small and Medium Towns (UIDSSMT) by amalgamating the earlier schemes of Integrated Development of Small & Medium Towns (IDSMT) and Accelerated Urban Water Supply Programme (AUWSP). The small and medium towns in the country will be covered for infrastructure development under this scheme. This fast track reform based scheme has to be implemented in mission mode.

In order to orient the officials with this new scheme a one day orientation workshop was organized on May 12, 2006 for the District Magistrates and Commissioners/Executive Officers of urban local bodies in U.P. The main objectives of the workshop were:

- i) To highlight the main provisions of the UIDSSMT scheme
- ii) To acquaint the officials with the measures taken and strategy developed by the state government for implementing the scheme
- iii) To discuss in depth the implementation process
- iv) To make the officials aware with the necessary precautionary measures to be followed at different stages of formulation and implementation of the scheme

#### Inauguration

The programme was inaugurated by Sri A.K. Mehta, Director (UD), Ministry of Urban Development, Government of India, New Delhi. At this occasion the chief guest releasted a booklet titled Bharat Mein Awasthapana Suvidhayen (Pariprekshya aur Ranniti) prepared by the Centre in Hindi.

In his welcome speech Prof. Nishith Rai, Director, Regional Centre highlighted the importance of UIDSSMT and other schemes launched by the Government of India in extending huge financial support for infrastructure development in cities and towns and advised the officials to make use of the facility.

#### Methodology

The whole day was divided in four sessions. The first session was devoted to a detailed presentation on UIDSSMT by Dr. U.B. Singh, Joint Director in the Centre. Sri S.P. Singh, Special Secretary to the State Government in the Department of Urban Development presented the strategy of State Government and the actions taken in connection with the implementation of the scheme. Sri A.K. Mehta, Director (UD), Ministry of Urban Development threw detailed light on the steps necessary for efficient implementation of the scheme and the precaution to be taken. The last session was devoted to the discussion. The participating officials raised a number of queries and a lively interaction was held.

#### Participation

The workshop was attended by District Magistrates, Municipal Commissioners of Municipal Corporations, Executive Officers of Municipal Boards and the officials of the Directorate of Urban Local Bodies (Nodal Agency) and the Town and Country Planning Department. #### Workshop on World Environment Day

#### DRY.LAND & DESERTIFICATION

The Regional Centre for Urban and Environmental Studies celebrated the World Environment Day on June 5, 2006 by organizing a workshop under joint auspices of Centre for Environment Education (North Zone), Lucknow. Solid Waste is probably the most visible form of pollution. Industrial wastes account for the majority of the discarded material. The handling of solid waste is a problem because most disposal methods damage the environment.

Rising levels of greenhouse gases (CH<sub>4</sub>, CO<sub>2</sub>, HOX, CFCs) in the earth's atmosphere are causing changes in our climate, and some of these changes can be traced to solid waste. Waste prevention and recycling help us better manage

the solid waste. But preventing waste and recycling also are project strategies for reducing greenhouse gases.

Thus, solid waste is one of the principal reasons of polluting the environment which leads to climate change on earth resulting into drying of the land and spreading desertification.

#### **Objectives**

In this backdrop the Workshop on World Environment Day was celebrated with the following objectives:

- To throw light on the experiences relating to waste management in other developing and developed countries;
- To discuss the shortcomings in the system of waste management practised by urban local bodies in India;
- To highlight the innovations adopted in this regard;
- To discuss the role and importance of community participation in protecting and preserving the urban eco system

#### Participation

The delegates included environmentalists from IIT, Kanpur, Delhi, and Lucknow NGOs, academics, people's representatives, senior citizens and urban managers. In all 32 delegates exchanged their views. The details of participants are furnished at **Annexure: LP-XXVIII**.

#### Inauguration

Sri S.P. Singh, Special Secretary to U.P. Government in the Department of Urban Development while inaugurating the programme, highlighted the process of managing waste in other countries especially in the USA and South Korea. He emphasised on the necessity of change in mind set and exhorted the urban local bodies to associate the people at large. He felt the need of managing waste in a scientific manner for preventing the environment and nature.

Earlier welcoming the Chief Guest and delegates, Prof. Nishith Rai, Director, RCUES termed unscientific management of urban waste as an urban menace. He said the proper management of waste can only save the human life which is endangered due to deteriorating environment.

#### **Proceedings**

The theme was introduced by Dr. U.B. Singh, Joint Director, RCUES. Elaborating the issues for discussion, he felt the need of public awareness towards civic duties.

Dr. Ram Boojh, Scientist, Centre for Environment Education (North Zone), Lucknow traced the history of the theme. He highlighted the reasons for spreading desertification and threw light on adverse impacts of waste on urban eco-system.

Dr. Richa Varmani, Joint Director, RCUES discussed in detail city planning in China city. She also presented the waste management practices in Sri Lanka (Colombo). Dr. Anjuli Mishra, Deputy Director, RCUES, threw light on waste management practices in Thailand (Bangkok). Dr. Rajeev Narayan, Deputy Director apprised about waste management system in South Korea and building plan in China.

Dr. Padma Vankar of IIT, Kanpur felt the need of spreading environmental awareness among the people. Dr. Aditya Pundir highlighted many good practices of Delhi and other places. Dr. N.K.S. More, of B.S.B.R. Ambedkar University, Lucknow threw light on importance of educating people. Dr. R.D. Singh, Former Director of Horticulture expressed his concerns towards cutting the trees unabatedly. Sri Bhaiya Ji highlighted the importance of nature in human life and called for associating all the stakeholders in protecting the environment.

# INCEPTION WORKSHOP On GOI-UNDP'S New Country Programme: Capacity Building For Decentralized Urban Governance

Jawaharlal Nehru National Urban Renewal mission (JNNURM) Programme has emerged as one of the significant national flagship projects in the urban sector. in support of this programme, Ministry of Urban Development (MoUD), Government of India in association with UNDP is implementing a project on "Capacity Development for Decentralized Urban Governance" in 16 cities located in four states: Rajasthan, Orissa, Kerala and Uttar Pradesh. The project envisages strengthening the local governance structure to take advantages of opportunities created under the JNNURM Programme.

The main objective of the project is to assist the ULBs to exercise better service delivery mechanism coupled with transparency and accountability in governance. The Regional Centre has been appointed as the State Level Implementing Agency for this project.

Keeping in view the importance of this time bound project, the Regional Centre organized a one day Inception Workshop on the above project on December 23, 2006.

#### **Objectives**

- I. To acquaint the participant with the concept of the project,
- II. To aware the participants about various components of the projects,
- III. To discuss the proposed strategy & Work plan of the project.
- IV. To acquaint the participants with Accounting reforms.
- V. To acquaint the participants with Property tax reforms

#### Focus Areas


Detailed presentations were made on the project strategy and work plan, Double Entry Accounting System, and Geographical Information System. Enough time was devoted on discussion and solving the queries put forward by the participants.

#### Participation

The participants for the Inception Workshop consisted of Mayors & Municipal Commissioners of Varanasi, Allahabad, Meerut Nagar Nigams, Chairman & Executive Officers of Mathura Nagar Palika Parishad, Officials from the Dept of Urban Development Govt. of U.P. and Directorate of Local Bodies, U.P. and Faculty of SLNA. **Annexure: LP-XXIX** presents the list of 28 participants.

#### Resource Persons

In the workshop besides internal faculty, services of the consultants in the field were used. The list of resource persons is given at **Annexure: LF-XXIX**.



#### **Observations**

The main outcome of the Workshop was that the participants and municipal officials felt informed about the project its aims and objectives the participants were also explained the detailed strategy and proposed workplan for the project. The participants also felt more sensitized towards the urgent need of implementing accounting and property tax reforms in the State. They were able to get more information about the latest technologies and best practices for implementing the reforms.

The Chief Guest of the Workshop was Shri Amal Kumar Verma, Principal Secretary, Dept. of Urban Development, Govt. of U.P. in his address laid emphasis on the use of GIS and through new technology interventions, the face of Urban Development can be changed for betterment. He also said that the persons who have vested interest will certainly oppose the reforms and use of above technology; hence our endeavor should be to ensure that such opposition is minimized. He instructed the officials of the four selected towns of the Project to work fast so that the project targets are met in time, as the project is to end on 31st December, 2007.

Shri S. P. Singh, Special Secretary, Deptt. of Urban Development, Govt. of U.P. in his remarks emphasized on the importance of the role of elected representatives and instructed the officials to take this Project seriously and make their Subordinate officials responsible by giving them targets. The project strategy and the proposed workplan were discussed at length. The workshop was appreciated by all the participants.

The programme was co-ordinated by Dr.Rajeev Narayan, Dy.Director.

#### Orientation Workshop for Newly Elected Hon'ble Mayors of Uttar Pradesh

With a view to orient the newly elected Hon'ble Mayors of Uttar Pradesh on various aspects of urban governance after the third elections to ULBs of the state were completed, a two day Orientation Workshop was organized by the Regional Centre on December 28-29-2008.

#### **Objectives**

Following were the key objectives of the workshop:

- To highlight the impact of urbanisation and changing scenario in urban administration
- To familiarise the participants with the 74<sup>th</sup> CAA, salient provisions of U.P. Municipal Corporation Act, 1959, municipal revenue resources and their mobilisation, their roles, duties and responsibilities etc.
- To emphasise upon the role of community and private sector in enhancing the delivery of municipal services
- To familiarise the participants with various urban sector schemes like SJSRY, JNNURM, UIDSSMT, IHSDP etc.
- To familiarise them with the good practices relating to good governance.

The workshop focussed on Urban Development and Administration with special reference to U.P., Municipal Revenue Resources, Role of Finance Commissions, Urban Infrastructure Schemes and their funding, PPP in Urban Development, Report Card System etc.

#### Inauguration

Sri A.K. Verma, Principal Secretary, Urban Development Department, Government of U.P. while inaugurating the workshop expressed his concern on the incomplete agenda of decentralisation as per intentions of 74<sup>th</sup> CAA. He sought the co-operation of Hob'ble Mayors for providing a new direction to urban development in the state.

#### Valediction

The workshop closed with a panel session on Challenges of Urban Development in U.P. presided over by Sri R.K. Mittal, Divisional Commissioner, Lucknow. Dr. S. C. Rai, former Mayor of Lucknow also graced the occasion as Special Guest. The Chief Guest stressed on the active involvement of all stake holders in the urban development process.



#### **Participation**

The workshop was attended by seven Hon'ble Mayors of Uttar Pradesh. The list of participants is annexed as **Annexure: LP-XXXI**.

#### **Feedback**

The workshop was appreciated by all the Mayors. They demanded that their rights should be enhanced and Mayor-in-Council system as prevalent in West Bengal and Madhya Pradesh should be introduced in U.P. also in order to make the administration more accountable. They suggested for the organisation of similar orientation workshops for all newly elected councillors also.

The workshop was co-ordinated by Dr. U.B. Singh, Joint Director.

### Orientation Workshop for Newly Elected Chairpersons of Class-I Urban Local Bodies

With a view to orient the newly elected Chairpersons of Class-I ULBs of Uttar Pradesh on various aspects of urban governance after the completion of third elections to ULBs in the state, the Regional Centre organized a two day **Orientation Workshop on January 5-6, 2008**.

The workshop was conducted keeping in view the similar objectives as mentioned in the earlier workshop held for Hon'ble Mayors of U.P.

While addressing the audience, Sri Khan laid strong stress on the regular conduct of meetings of house, decent behaviour and formulation of implementable projects.

Earlier Prof. Nishith Rai, Director of the Centre welcomed the Chief Guest and delegates to the workshop. He emphasized on obtaining the maximum benefit from the recently launched ambitious schemes of Government of India and necessity of imposition of user charges.

#### Feedback and Suggestions

All chairpersons provided their active contribution. They made following major demands.

- Interference of district administration in the local administration should be stopped
- ➤ ULBs should be informed about the activities carried out in urban areas through MP/MLA/any other fund
- Vacant posts lying in ULBs should be filled up
- More administrative and financial powers according to 74<sup>th</sup> CAA should be devolved to ULBs
- A portion of development charges should be handed over to ULBs for the maintenance of colonies built by other agencies.

The workshop was co-ordinated by Dr. U.B. Singh, Joint Director.

#### WORKSHOP ON PRESENTATION OF PUBLIC PRIVATE PARTNERSHIP MANUAL

Regional Centre organized a one day workshop on March 21, 2007 to discuss the draft manual on Public Private Partnership prepared by the centre. The manual was developed keeping in view the growing need and demand of a document which should serve as a ready reckoner—to the officials of Urban Local Bodies to provide efficient municipal services with private participation.

#### **OBJECTIVE**

The objective of workshop was.

- 1. To discuss the draft Manual.
- 2. To suggest additions and changes if required in the manual.

Detailed presentations were made on all the aspects of the draft PPP Manual. Mr. Chetan Sharma, consultant RCUES made the detailed presentation on the draft PPP Manual. Enough time was devoted on discussion and suggestions put forward by the participants.

#### **PARTICIPATION**

In all 33 participants including Mayors, Chairmen, Municipal Commissioners and Executive Officers of Class-I Towns, Officers of Department of Urban Development and Directorate of Local Bodies, Government of U.P. and faculty members of RCUES took part in this workshop. **Annexure: LP-XXXIII** provides the list of participants.

#### **OBSERVATIONS**

The main outcome of the Workshop was that the participants felt more informed towards the urgent need of a manual which could serve as a handbook for involving private participation in urban services. The various suggestions put forward during the workshop would be incorporated in the draft manual so that it becomes more comprehensive and serves the purpose.

Some of the major suggestions put forward during the workshop were:

- Manual should be in Hindi language for better understanding by the ULB officials.
- Various aspects of the partnership should be made clear in the manual.
- Specific roadmap for involving private participation is required.
- The manual should serve as an ultimate handbook

**Shri Anil Kumar Sagar,** Director, Directorate of Local Bodies, Govt. of U.P. was of the view that the role and responsibilities of ULBs have increased tremendously but the ULBs lack the latest know-how for improved service delivery. To enhance the services quality and efficiency private participation is required, hence a Manual is being developed which will go a long way in improving the service delivery of the ULBs.

Shri S.P.Singh, Special Secretary, Dept. of Urban Development, Govt. of U.P. expressed that the Public Private Partnership Manual should be comprehensive and should serve as an ultimate handbook for the ULBs in order to help them involve private participation for providing improved efficient urban services. He forcefully said that monitoring is very important in Public Private Partnership for good Urban services.

After welcoming the guests and participants, **Prof. Nishith Rai, Director, RCUES**, informed the audience about the need and importance of developing a Manual for Public Private Partnership by the Centre. The same was now put up for discussion in the workshop for the views of participants to give it a final shape. After the final Manual would be prepared by centre then it will be very much helpful to improve urban services through Public Private Partnership.

**Dr. Rajeev Narayan Dy. Director, RCUES & workshop coordinator** gave a brief presentation on objectives and components of the Manual to all participants. He emphasised that the every area of Urban services like (sewerage, water supply solid waste management, sanitation, etc) can be improved through Public Private Partnership.

**Shri Chetan Sharma, consultant of RCUES**, after presentation of Draft Manual, invited queries and suggestion. from participants to give final shape to the Manual.

#### Workshop on JNNURM, UIDSSMT & IHSDP

The Government of India in the Ministry of Urban Development has launched simultaneously three schemes for development of urban infrastructure in all the towns in the country. The selected large towns are proposed to be covered under the JNNURM and the remaining ones are covered under UIDSSMT and IHSDP.

It was thought necessary to orient the policy makers and implementers of these schemes in Jharkhand and as such a one day workshop on JNNURM, UIDSSMT & IHSDP was organized at Ranchi on June 12, 2006.

#### **Objectives**

The main objectives of the workshop included:

- To highlight the main provisions of the JNNURM, UIDSSMT and IHSDP
- To acquaint the officers with the measures taken and strategy developed by the State Government for implementing these schemes
- To discuss in depth the implementation process
- To make the officials aware with the necessary preconditions to be taken at different stages of formulation and implementation of these schemes.

#### Inauguration

The workshop was chaired by Sri Raghubar Das, Hon'ble Minister for Urban Development, Government of Jharkhand. In his opening remarks the Hon'ble Minister thanked the Government of India for launching these schemes of urban infrastructure development. He emphasized on initiating proposals for developing the small and medium towns.

#### **Presentations**

Sri M.K.Mandal, Chief Secretary, Government of Jharhand appreciated the presentations and advised the officials to work hard for city development. He emphasized on protecting the environment and conserving the heritage. He assured the RCUES of all help in working for the state.

In his remarks Prof.Nishith Rai, Director, RCUES welcomed the initiation taken by the State Government in making use of the expertise available with RCUES. He felt the need of speedy implementation of these schemes. Prof.Rai advised to take care of water bodies present in Ranchi town.



#### PANEL DISCUSSION

The first half of last day of each programme was planned for a Pannel Discussion on URBAN MANAGEMENT IN NEW MILLENNIUM: EMERGING ISSUES. The panelists included Sri R.K. Mittal, Divisional Commissioner, Lucknow, Padmashree Dr. S.C. Rai, former Mayor of Lucknow, Sri S.H.M. Rijvi, formerly Joint Director of Urban Local Bodies U.P., Sri A.K. Gupta, Chief Engineer, Directorate of Urban Local Bodies, U.P. and other experts.

#### **INAUGURATION**

The series of programmes was inaugurated by Sri A.K. Verma, Principal Secretary to Government of U.P. in the Department of Urban Development. In his address he said that with the increase in population and awareness the expectations of public have increased tremendously. People want qualitative and efficient services but urban local bodies have miserably failed in this regard. He exhorted the urban officials to increase their resources while making best use of the resources made available by the state. He adused the officers to develop their capacity to fulfill the expectations of the people.



Speaking as a special guest Sri R.K. Srivastava, Secretary, Urban Development, Government of Jharkhand, felt the need of widening the tax base of

municipalities. He said that the cities having the same population are having budgets of incomparable amounts. He found that the municipalities in the states having octroi are financially better than those where octroi has been abolished. It is therefore necessary to rethink on introduction of octroi if municipalities have to be made to act as third layer of government. Sri Anil Kumar Sagar, Director of Urban Local Bodies also expressed his views and said that urban good governance may be ensured through use of suitable and modern technolgy in delivery of services and improving efficiency and effectiveness in governance. Prof. Nishith Rai, Director, RCUES, Lucknow that welcome the guests highlighted the relevances of organization and the training programmes. Dr. U.B. Singh, Joint Director, RCUES, Lucknow conducted the session and threw light on objectives and frame work of the programme.

#### VALEDICTION

The first programme concluded with the distribution of certificates by Sri R.K. Mittal, Divisional Commissioner, Lucknow. In his address the chief guest emphasized on associating community with urban administration and management. He advised the participants to follow a humane approach to administration. The session was presided over by Dr. S.C. Rai former Mayor of Lucknow. Dr. Rai in his address highlighted a number of problems including weak tax base, lack of professionalism, unconcerned community etc. which are hindering the efficient provision of urban services.

In his address Prof. Singh advised the officers to be sensitive to the problems of the public. He felt the need of associating community with the waste management and thus improving the environment.

He advised the officers to work efficiently and devotedly for the development of urban areas and to mobilize the existing financial resources besides tapping additional ones.



## **Participation**

About 20 participants including Municipal Commissioners, Additional Municipal Commissioners from Nagar Nigams and officials of Urban Development Department and Jal Sansthans, Executive Officers from ULBs attended the first workshop, while IInd and IIIrd workshops were attended by about 70 participants each. # Feedback & Suggestions

The main outcome of the workshop was that the ULB officials got more informed about the quality of services being provided by them in their local body. They came to know about observation and responses of the citizens regarding the quality of services and also the assessment of the citizens about their performance. They got sensitized towards the urgent needs of the citizens and the priority areas to be taken up for the Action Plan.

Sri Anil Kumar Sagar, Director Local Bodies, suggested that based on the findings of the report card, priority areas should be taken up and Action Plan to be formulated on that basis. He was of the view that the assessment and suggestions of the citizens would help in improving the working of the local bodies.

# JNNURM, IHSDP AND PREPARATION OF DETAILED PROJECT REPORTS (DPR)

A three days residential training programme on JNNURM, IHSDP AND PREPARATION OF DETAILED PROJECT REPORTS (DPR) was conducted by the Regional Centre, Lucknow, from 5-7 September, 2006. The programme was sponsored by the State Urban Development Agency (SUDA), Uttar Pradesh.

# **Objectives**

- To help the participants understand about the various aspects, elements and techniques of Detailed Project Report Preparation and its appraisal
- To help the participants visualize a road map for the success of JNNURM

#### Focus Areas

The contents of the programme included Impact of Urbanisation on Formulation of policies since independence and their effects on poverty alleviation, JNNURM – Dimensions, strategies and provision of basic services to urban poor, Provisions of Integrated Housing and Slum Development Programme, Elements required for the preparation of projects related to LCS, sewerage, water supply, drainage and solid waste management, Appraisal of urban projects and building a road map for success of JNNURM.

# ROLE OF URBAN LOCAL BODIES IN DISASTER MANAGEMENT

India is one of the world's major theatres of disasters both natural and human made. Floods, droughts, cyclones, earthquakes, communal riots, fires, epidemics etc. pound it end to end every year. Increasing urbanization, expansion with unsuitable vulnerable construction, non-engineered unsafe construction aging building and infrastructure etc. are some of the causes of disasters in urban areas. People tend to live in disaster prone areas due to severe stress on land, high prices of land and construction of buildings, poverty, migration and non-regulation of urban housing construction. Even, the natural protection measures are neglected to pave the way for economic development.

In the state of Uttar Pradesh, 13 districts fall under 125 most vulnerable districts of India, as per Vulnerability Atlas. The local bodies may be effective instruments in tackling disasters through early warning system, relief distribution, providing shelter to the victims, medical assistance etc. Against this view point a two days orientation training programme on Role of Urban Local Bodies in Disaster Management was held on February 26 & 27, 2007 to orient the officials of urban local bodies regarding various aspects and dimensions of disaster management.

### **Objectives**

The workshop had the following objectives.

- To review the status, situation, dimensions and trends of disasters and their impact on development
- To examine role of government agencies, and local self government in disaster mitigation and response
- To examine the role of NGO's, civil societies and other stakeholders in disaster management
- To discuss legal and policy framework of disaster management
- To orient officials regarding planning for prevention and response of disasters as well as rehabilitation and reconstruction of disaster affected victims and areas
- To suggest measures for mitigating and response of natural disasters

The programme focussed on legal and policy framework for disaster management, planning for prevention of disasters, disaster response, rehabilitation and reconstruction etc.

# Participation:

In all 36 officials participated in the programme from various Local Bodies, Jal Sansthans and Water Works Departments of U.P. The detail of participants is given in **Annexure: LP-LIV**

## Inauguration

The programme was inaugurated by Prof. Nishith Rai, Director, RCUES, Lucknow. He stressed the need of strengthening urban local bodies for their active role in disaster management.

#### Valediction

Sri Amal Kumar Verma, Principal Secretary, Department of Urban Development, Government of Uttar Pradesh, Lucknow was the Chief Guest at the valedictory session. While addressing the participants, he mentioned that urban local bodies are to be strengthened through capacity building in disaster management in order to make them efficient in taking active role in disaster management in their respective local bodies. Sri Verma emphasised on preparedness and mitigation rather than getting ready when the disaster has happened.

#### Feedback & Suggestions

The participants appreciated the programme. They said that the programme will be helpful for them for delivering their services during disasters. However, they felt that the duration of the programme should be extended to seven days, so that they are well versed with the technical and theoretical aspects and dimension of disaster management.

#### SPECIAL ACTIVITIES

## Jawaharlal Nehru National Urban Renewal Mission

The Regional Centre for Urban and Environmental Studies has been designated as STATE RESOURCE CENTRE (SRC) by the Department of Urban Development, Government of U.P. for the various activities viz. training, information, education and communication and for monitoring and evaluation of various projects associated with the implementation of JNNURM.

Seven cities from Uttar Pradesh viz. Lucknow, Kanpur, Allahabad, Agra, Varanasi, Meerut and Mathura have been identified under JNNURM for the central assistance for implementing various sectoral schemes meant for the planned development of cities during the Mission period of seven years.

Preparation of City Development Plan is a pre-requisite for availing monetary assistance under the Mission. The Regional Centre in its capacity of SRC along with the Department of Urban Development, Government of Uttar Pradesh undertook the task of selecting appropriate consultancy firms for preparation of CDP on behalf of the seven cities. After the selection of consultants, the Regional Centre continuously monitored and reviewed the preparation of CDP within the prescribed duration.

After the presentation of inception reports and rapid assessment reports, the consultants were required to make presentation of Draft CDP reports at the inter- departmental meetings held at the Regional Centre. The key purpose of these inter-state departmental meetings was to deliberate together on the draft CDPs prepared by consultancy organisations so that a final shape could be given to the plan after consensus of all concerned for the integrated development of Mission cities. These meetings were held under the Chairmanship of Principal Secretary, Department of Urban Development, Government of Uttar Pradesh and were attended by Divisional Commissioners, Municipal Commissioners/Additional Magistrates. Commissioners of identified cities, senior officials from the departments of Urban Development, Housing and Urban Planning, Transport, Tourism, Heritage, PWD, Finance, U.P.Jal Nigam, Jal Sansthans, Housing Board, State Urban Development Agency, besides Prof. Nishith Rai, Director, Dr. Urmila Bagga, Joint Director and Dr.K.Sreeram, Consulatant from the Centre. Valuable suggestions and important technical inputs were provided to the consultancy firms by the Centre based on the guidelines issued by the Government of India and the observations made by appraisal agencies while approving CDPs of other cities.

Presentations of draft CDPs for Lucknow and Kanpur were held on July 25, 2006, for Allahabad and Varanasi on July 26, 2006 and for Meerut, Mathura and Agra on July 27, 2006. A revised presentation for Lucknow was again made on July 31, 2006.

Final CDPs for all the seven cities were submitted to Ministry of Urban Development, Government of India for appraisal during mid of August 2006. CDPs of all the seven cities viz. Lucknow, Kanpur, Allhabad, Varanasi, Meerut, Agra and Mathura have been approved by the Ministry.

Further. Review Meetings in order to ascertain the status of DPRs for various eligible sectors in the overall context of CDP were also held at the Centre. A Review Meeting for Agra and Meerut was held on September 20, 2006, for Kanpur, Allahabad and Mathura on September 21, 2006 and for Lucknow and Varanasi on September 22, 2006.

Besides all the miscellaneous activities relating to JNNURM, all the above mentioned inter departmental meetings relating to presentation of inception reports, rapid assessment reports and draft CDPs prepared by the consultants for the cities of Lucknow, Kanpur, Allahabad, Agra, Varanasi, Meerut and Mathura were conducted and co-ordinated jointly by Dr.Urmila Bagga, Joint Director and Co-ordinator JNNURM and Dr.K.Sreeram, Consultant in the Regional Centre.

The programme was coordinated by Dr. U.B. Singh, Joint Director.


# Orientation Meet of South African Delegation

# VISIT OF SOUTH AFRICAN DELEGATION TO RCUES, LUCKNOW

A high level South African Government's Delegation led by Dr. Essop Goolam Pahad, Hon'ble Minister for Communications & Information System, Presidency of Republic of South Africa visited RCUES, Lucknow on 11<sup>th</sup> November, 2006.

This may, according to him, help benefit the practitioners in learning by exchange of experiences and ideas. Earlier Professor Nishith Rai, Director, RCUES, Lucknow welcomed the guests and participants.

Municipal Commissioners, Executive Officers, General Managers, Professionals, members of civil society, representatives of NGOs, and academics were invited to deliberative in the formation workshop. In all 80 delegates, including representatives of ICMA/CMA, USAID and RCUES attended the workshop.

Sri N. Bhattacharjee. Urban Team Leader. USAID explained the context of forming the City Managers Association in U.P. Ms. Manvita Baradi, ICMA Director, South Asia deliberated on the structure and experiences of different CMAs in India. Sri A. Agarwal, Coordinator. CMA-MP highlighted the working and experiences of CMA-MP.

Tripathi, General Manager, Jal Sansthan of Varanasi and Dr. Richa Varmani, Joint Director, RCUES, Lucknow respectively.

# V: Research Studies and Consultancy

# RESEARCH STUDIES AND CONSULTANCY

# 1. Rain Water Harvesting: A Case Study of Lucknow

The present study emphasizes on the importance of rainwater harvesting in water conservation and management. The study depicts the scale and magnitude of water crisis that has emerged due to over extraction of ground water in order to meet the ever-increasing diverse sectoral demands of urban population with particular reference to UP and Lucknow. The report also highlights policy interventions and institutional mechanism initiated at the state level for adopting, implementing and monitoring the rainwater harvesting in urban areas of the state. It also provides recommendations and measures — both at the individual and community levels as well as at the level of government and industries that need to be adopted in order to maximize the impact of these initiatives in the future years.

#### Recommendations

- Although enormous ground water related information are available with the state ground water deptt. as well as fragmented data is also available with other deptts. viz Irrigation, Jal Nigam, Jal Sansthan, Remote Sensing Applications Centre, Swajal etc., an urgent need is now increasingly felt to create a GIS based computerised data bank of ground water resources.
- Hydro geological maps of urban areas are the fore most requirements for identifying the highly stressed water aquifers so that the appropriate rain water harvesting / recharging schemes may be planned and executed on priority basis for such locations.
- An inventory of government as well as private tube wells / borings in the urban areas needs to be made, maintained and updated regularly on priority basis.
- Prilling of tube wells etc. need to be banned in the over exploited and critical areas.
- A regular mechanism for regulating / monitoring quantum of ground water extraction from individual industries and quality of water needs to be put in place to check the over exploitation and pollution of ground water.

- Water supply in the city may be managed by establishing tube wells in the peripheral areas of the city instead of digging /operating tube wells in the areas experiencing alarming decline in the water table.
- Commercial activities based on the ground water should not be encouraged within the city limits.
- Govt. departments / agencies, public private developers / societies, Jal Nigam, Jal Sansthans, industrial / commercial establishments etc. should be made to procure no objection / clearance certificate from the ground water deptt. before going for extraction of ground water in order to check and regulate the haphazard and indiscriminate withdrawal from water aquifers.
- It should be mandatory for the new water recreational resorts / parks, water bottling industries, soft drink industries, other ground water based industries etc. to obtain ground water clearance / licence from the State Ground Water Nodal Agency. Existing water based industries should also be made to obtain annual consent from the State Ground Water Board.
- Regular public awareness campaigns for sensitising community towards prevailing critical ground water scenario and their role and contribution in water conservation should be carried out extensively.
- Hoardings, slides etc. with clear and effective message for discouraging wasteful use of water and encouraging water efficient behaviour should be placed / used at strategic locations, public places, community centres, educational institutions, theatres, cinema halls etc.
- Regular training and capacity building programmes should also be organised for the govt. institutions, NGOs,, elected representatives etc. who are associated with the urban administration and management.
- Science-tons are powerful tools for orienting the mind set of officials / non-officials, public and must be frequently used at seminars / conferences etc. for familiarizing the delegates, public etc. with the prevailing critical water situation.
- Ground Water Control and Regulation Act should be enacted in the state without any further delay as has been implemented in few other states and should be strictly implemented to prevent indiscriminate extraction of ground water.
- Media especially the electronic media is a very powerful and effective medium for impacting the mind set and behavior of the society at large. With the presence of T.V. / Cable TV in majority of the house holds in cities / towns,

the regular demonstration of simple & effective captions, visuals, cartoons etc. highlighting the significance of ground water / water can definitely mould / impact the attitude and behavior of the community and make them water literate.

- Print media can also play a constructive role towards sensitizing and educating the public for ensuring the best and economical use of available water resources and water conservation by restricting / reserving a significant corner / place in the newspapers etc. for appropriate captions, cartoons, messages etc.
- Since students and small children are more receptive and attentive to such ideas and can definitely influence their parents. NGOs, civil society / social organizations like Lions, Rotary Clubs etc. should be roped in for visiting the school children at regular intervals.
- It is a common knowledge that people in large numbers attend the congregations of spiritual Gurus in every city / town. Such spiritual Gurus / saints may also be contacted and requested to include the subject of water conservation in their public meetings / discourses since these saints can easily influence the public mind in shorter duration.
- Individuals / institutions / NGOs/ CBOs / Resident Welfare Associations etc. can be suitably rewarded for taking and sustaining the initiatives in implementing and popularizing the rain water harvesting in their areas/colonies etc

The study was carried out by Dr. Urmila Bagga, Jt. Director in the Centre.

# 2. Role Conflict among Women Representatives in Panchayati Raj Institutions (A case study of Uttar Pradesh)

This research study was sponsored by National Commission for women, New Delhi. The study covered 12 Zila Panchayats, 36 Kshetra Panchayats and 108 Gram Panchayats, covering 1003 elected women representatives. The recommendations were meant for Central Government, State Government, Local Government and Women Commission. The main recommendations were as under:

- i) A comprehensive empowerment action plan for developing the capacity of women representatives should be prepared at the national/state/local level.
- ii) The Rural Development Programmes should be formulated, implemented and monitored by the Panchayati Raj Institutions.

- There is an imperative need to build up rural bureaucracy. Manning the PRIs from officials belonging to other departments can never strengthen these institutions.
- iv) The presence of members of upper legislatures in PRIs some times creates problems. The local leaders having link with them rule the roost. It does also provide scope for proxy representation.
- The local governments have become good place for political part to play politics rather than development of political instincts among the uneducated or less educated rural community, especially women.

vi) The Acts/laws should be amended to dislodge the Chairpersons/Members found guilty of encouraging or practicing proxy representation.

- vii) The woman chairpersons should be given proper orientation for not allowing the male family members to represent women representatives. At first meeting only they should make this clear to all the members. Actually it is the chairperson who can turn the table.
- viii) The women chairpersons should act as role model and then can take any bold steps to stop proxy representation.
- ix) The meetings of Gram Sabha should be held regularly and periodically to make all the adult villagers aware of the programmes, roles and responsibilities etc.
- x) The commission for women should play pro-active role. It should treat proxy representation also an important issue related to women.

The research team was consisted of U.B. Singh (Principal Investigator/Project Director), Dr. K.K. Singh, Sri A.K. Singh and Sri D.C. Pant.

# 3. Assessment of Existing System in Urban Local Bodies of Uttar Pradesh for Implementation of Double Entry Accounting System

Under the above study the Centre got a rapid assessment done of the status of existing accounting system in the ULBs of Uttar Pradesh. Further it also developed the TOR for the Nodal Agency for preparation of DEAS Manual and Software Development for implementation of Double Entry Accounting System in the ULBs of Uttar Pradesh.

# 4. Assessment of Existing System, Practices and Status of Property Tax Collection and Requirements for GIS for Property Tax Enhancement in the ULBs of Uttar Pradesh

Under the above study the Centre conducted an assessment study of the existing system of Property tax management in urban local bodies of U.P. Further under the study an assessment was also done to identify the best

methodology to be adopted for implementation of GIS based property tax reforms along with requirement of hardware and software. Under the study an estimate was also done for budget requirement and Request for Proposal document along with Terms of Reference for selection of implementation agencies was also prepared.

## 5. Rapid Assessment of Status of Infrastructure & Services in Mission Towns of U.P.

Under the study a rapid assessment was done to know the status of the infrastructure and services along with identification of gaps of all the 7 Mission Towns. The study further focused on the budget requirements for filling the identified gaps and also suggested strategy for future development. The main purpose of the study was to server as a base information document for preparation of City Development Plans of the Mission Towns of U.P.

## 6. New Capacity Building Issues in the Context of JNNURM, UIDSSMT. IHSDP and E-Governance

The entire developing world is witness to an unprecedented shift of human settlement to the cities. It can be seen that urban India also faces a daunting challenge. Cities must cope with great numbers of people, plan to provide them services, find resources to meet needs of maintaining and augmenting infrastructures respond to the urbanization and poverty, preserve their environment and retain their competitive edge. Enmeshed in the web of rigid, inflexible working cultures and erosion of all round capacity they must reengineer themselves to face these enormously complex challenges. This reengineering is precisely the goal of good urban governance. It envisages improving the quality of life in cities through improved local governance by reinventing a city as an inclusive city. Such a city provides space and voice to all its stakeholders through inclusive decision making since decision making is the heart of good governance.

It is widely recognized that urban infrastructure services are the life line of cities and urban settlements. Urban Infrastructure plays immense role in providing basic and ancillary urban services to citizens to ensure their quality of life. However lack of long term development strategy, paucity of resources, weak managerial structure and operational deficiencies continue to hinder growth of efficient and environment friendly urban habitats.

Many initiatives like JNNURM, UIDSSMT and IHSDP schemes, are being taken up by the Central Government, State and Local/city Governments,

for addressing the challenges and providing improved housing and infrastructure services and facilities. Many cities have also taken up innovative practices for managing the cities in an effective and efficient manner. The city information system for service providers has also shown improvement through computerization and E-Governance initiatives by providing information for various services in increasingly user-friendly manner for the matters related to urban affairs. The study recommended various policy matters and strategy needs to address.

### 7. Slum Upgradation Strategy: A Case Study Of Lucknow City

Lucknow city is characterized by a very significant presence of the urban poor, with a growing poverty profile. Slum settlements have multiplied over years and the living conditions of the poor have not improved much. Environmental decline, inadequate basic services and infrastructure in the poor settlements hit the poor hardest. Slums are scattered across the city in different wards. It is estimated that many slums are located on private lands without access to basic services. The poor, not only habitate the slums of the city but are spread in squatters and informal settlements in small groups on the sides of railway lines, river beds, etc., deprived of basic services. This makes them more vulnerable to vicissitudes of nature and periodic threats of eviction, ejection and demolition. No authentic data is available on the number of such settlements and their population. Another feature that Lucknow city consists of out growths which are presently not part of the corporation area but inextricably linked with the city both spatially and economically. In all these areas the poor population is very high and all these areas can be considered to be slums without basic infrastructure -physical and social.

The number of slums and slum population in Lucknow city are increasing at a faster pace over the decades. DUDA's estimation of slum population is a conservative increase over the Census estimation. However, a survey report released by Oxfam Trust (India) in 2005 indicates that there are 787 poor settlements in the city that can be categorized as slums - authorized and unauthorized. Approximately 11 lakh people are living in slums with few basic civic amenities.

Despite several initiatives taken by the central and state governments and the Corporation and other agencies towards poverty alleviation there are several critical issues and challenges that need to be addressed. They include: Lack of Authentic Data, Land Tenure, Infrastructure Deficiency, Neglect of Informal Settlements, Weak Municipal Resource Base, Lack of

**convergence**, **Vulnerability**. The civil society needs to be actively associated with the poverty programmes.

### 8. A Draft of Proposed Urban Policy of Uttar Pradesh

There is an unprecedented shift of human settlements to the cities in the developing countries and the same phenomenon is being witnessed in India. In fact. India is witnessing a rapid pace of urbanization and is recognized as one of the fastest growing urbanizing countries in the world. Indian cities have strongly emerged as the prime engines of the Indian Economy and generators of national wealth. It is evident that as economies grow and human activities diversify, the influx of population is greater around the centres of goods and services, giving rise to concentration of workers and their families around places of work, which with the passage of time turns into cities and later into larger cities and metropolitan areas. This increasing pace of urbanization creates a constant pressure on provider of essential urban services. Thus the urban government institutions have to strengthen their resources, organisations and capacities to deliver essential civic services like roads, sanitation, drinking water, waste disposal, sewerage and drainage facilities, street lighting, recreational areas etc.

### **Current Status**

- 1. **Population**: U.P. is the most populous State of the Country, accounting for 16.17% of India's population. As the population in the cities rise, there is a constant threat to the urban environment.
- 2. **Poverty**: Expanding slums have caused serious distortions in urban life. Poverty remains entrenched.
- 3. **Pollution**: For improving urban environment, both in terms of reduced pollution levels and aesthetic factors it is very important to undertake greening of cities and towns through plantation of urban forests, roadside plantation, river bank plantation and by setting up parts.
- 4. Paucity of Funds: The share of grants has come down to around 7%.

### **Action Areas**

It is proposed that the Urban Policy may be initially implemented in the following areas in order to tackle the vicious cycle of ever increasing population, poverty, pollution of the environment and paucity of municipal resources:

- 1. Expansion of Services
- 2. Eradication of Poverty

- 3. Environmental Upgradation
- 4. Enforcement of Rules
- 5. Empowerment of Community
- 6. Equity and Equality
- 7. Enlargement of Financial Resource Base
- 8. E-Governance
- 9. Capacity Building

### Agenda of Reforms

To achieve this objective, the State Government and Urban Local Bodies will be required to accept implementation of an agenda of reforms as proposed by the Government of India in its National Urban Reforms Mission (NURM). These proposed reforms shall broadly fall into two categories:

- Mandatory reforms (a) Reforms at Urban Local Body (ULB) level (b) Reforms at State level
- > Optional Reforms

### Conclusion

On completion of the above mentioned Mission, it is expected that ULBs will achieve the following outcomes:

- Modern and transparent budgeting, accounting, financial management systems designed and adopted for all urban services and governance functions.
- City-wide framework for planning and governance will be established and become operational
- All urban residents will be able to obtain access to a basic level of urban services
- Financially self sustaining agencies for urban governance and service delivery will be established, through reforms to major revenue instruments.
- Local services and governance will be conducted in a manner that is transparent and accountable to citizens.
- E-Governance applications will be introduced in core functions of ULBs resulting in reduced cost and time of service delivery processes.
