Regional Workshop on Septage and Fecal Sludge Management

LUCKNOW

The Ministry of Urban Development, Government of India implemented Swacch Bharat Mission (SBM) with a goal to make the country clean and open defecation free, and realizes the importance of establishing proper Fecal Sludge and Septage Management (FSSM). In this context, a two day Regional Workshop was organized by RCUES Lucknow from 23-24 December 2016 for the officials of its nine constituent states. The main objectives of the workshop were: to highlight the various issues and challenges related to FSSM, to disseminate information on technologies & practices in FSM, to discuss the initiatives by different State Government and provided a platform for cross learning and moving ahead for effective implementation of FSSM, to deliberate on the structuring of FSM Projects and their financing methodologies. The sessions were a mix of theoretical knowledge and a sneak-peek into the ground reality through Case Studies. Along with the

experts **CEPT** internal faculties from Ahmedabad, Infrastructure Development Corporation Karnataka Limited (iDeCK), Water Aid India and Consortium for DEWATS Dissemination Society Bengaluru, also took extensive sessions on various facets of FSSM. The participants of the training programme consisted of Junior Engineers, Executive Officers from Nagar Palika Parishads of ULBs. In all 42 participants participated in the programme. The programme was coordinated by Dr. Alka Singh, Deputy Director, RCUES Lucknow.

Training Programme on Management of Water Supply, Sewerage, Septage and Drainage in Urban Local Bodies Capsule II (Uttar Pradesh)

The Regional Centre organized two three day Specialized Training Programme (2nd Capsule) under AMRUT for the officials of Engineering wing of Uttar Pradesh, at Lucknow on 5th –7th December 2016. These officials had attended the 1st Capsule of Orientation Training under AMRUT and were further nominated for the Capsule 2 training on Management of Water Supply, Sewerage, Septage and Drainage in Urban Local Bodies based on thematic area identified by the participants in the Training Need Assessment (TNA) done by the Regional Centre. The main objectives of the programme were to prepare the participants for implementing service level benchmarks in water

supply, Sewerage and drainage and their current service levels in AMRUT Cities; to discuss about the approaches and methods for demand assessment and estimation of water quantity and quality; to detail out the design standards and specifications for water supply schemes, O&M related to water treatment plants. The sessions included practical exercises to help participants in identification of projects under AMRUT, framing of Service Level Improvement Plans related to water supply, sewerage and drainage. An overview of Fecal Sludge and Sewerage Management (FSSM) was also dealt as part of the workshop for cities having partial or no sewerage system. In all 30 participants were nominated in each programme from the ULB's covered under AMRUT mission in U.P. out of which the no. of participants who attended the programmes were 12 & 22. Gujarat, Andhra Pradesh becomes first states to achieve ODF status

Gujarat and Andhra Pradesh have become the first states to declare all cities and towns in respective states as Open Defecation Free (ODF) and a few districts including Porbandar have also been declared ODF, on the 147th Birth Anniversary of Mahatama Gandhi which was also the second anniversary of Swachh Bharat Mission.

BRICS Nations join hands to save environment

The Environment Ministers of BRICS countries have agreed on a MoU and announced setting up of a Joint Working Group, institutionalizing their mutual cooperation on environment-related issues. The Ministerial Declaration highlights key agreements, which were adopted by mutual consensus. The areas agreed for mutual cooperation are - abatement and control of air and water pollution, efficient management of liquid and solid waste, climate change and conservation of biodiversity.

Delhi Airport becomes the first carbon neutral airport in Asia-Pacific

Delhi Airport, which is run by the GMR consortium-Airports Authority of India (AAI), has become the first carbon neutral airport in Asia-Pacific following a series of measures undertaken by it to reduce the carbon footprint that included setting up of a 7.84MW solar power plant. The announcement was made by the international body of aerodrome operators across the world, ACI during the Airport Carbon Accreditation certificate presentation ceremony in Montreal, Canada. According to a release, the Airport Carbon Accreditation has upgraded the Delhi Airport to the highest level of certification, level 3+ neutrality available to airports across the world. Carbon neutrality happens when the net carbon emissions over an entire year are zero or when the airport absorbs or offsets the same amount of emission generated. This achievement is accredited by ACI under Airport Carbon Accreditation that monitors the efforts of airports to manage and reduce their carbon emissions.

Ministry of Urban Development approves projects worth `114 crore under HRIDAY

Ministry of Urban Development has approved projects worth `114 crore under Heritage Infrastructure Development and Augmentation Yojana (HRIDAY) for improving infrastructure facilities around core heritage sites in five cities of Varanasi, Amritsar, Dwaraka, Puri and Warangal. An interministerial HRIDAY National Empowered Committee chaired by Rajiv Gauba, Secretary (UD) has already cleared Detailed Project Reports of these five cities.

MoUD & Amar Chitra Katha sign MoU to publish comic on Swachh Bharat Mission

The Ministry of Urban Development (MoUD) has signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with Amar Chitra Katha to publish and distribute a special edition of the comic book, focusing on Swachh Bharat Mission. The 32-page comic book would carry messages pertaining to sanitation and solid waste components of Swachh Bharat Mission. The book would comprise a series of inspirational stories from the mission, cleanliness rankings of cities, the public figures and ambassadors, environmental impact, and stories of individuals and organisations that can inspire children to the concept of 'Swachhata'. Further, there would be an interactive workbook of tips and tricks which children can use to clean their own areas. It would also include a section about how to organise community cleanliness drives and what other things they can do to make a remarkable impact on their immediate surroundings. Amar Chitra Katha would be developing and creating the special edition comic book in English and translating into Hindi. In order to ensure large-scale dissemination of these stories, MoUD would distribute them through national school boards like CBSE, Kendriya Vidyalaya and Navodaya Vidyalaya.

Govt has entered into a partnership with National Association of Soft Ware and Services Companies (NASSOCOM), Manufacturing Association of Information Technology (MAIT) and Ministry of Electronics & Information Technology, Govt of India for control and management of e-waste in the city of Bhubaneswar.
